The Alhambra order has been carrying on the project of presenting nuns and lay teachers with these scholarships, recipients of which may attend any school of their choice. The order's serious ideals embrace promotion of the education of retarded children and marking of Catholic Historical locations. Grants of \$29,000 in scholarships have been presented to teachers in the United States, Canada and Mexico according to Grand Vizier John Stone who came from Buffalo for the presentation.

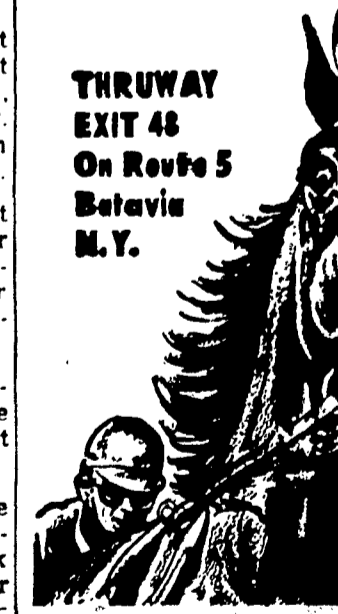
