

Baranowski To Direct Nazareth, Fisher Drama

The broadening academic alliance between Nazareth College and St. John Fisher College has been extended to the dramatic clubs of the two colleges. The announcement was made yesterday by the Rev. Charles J. Lavery of St. John Fisher, and Sister Helen Daniel, president of Nazareth.

Joseph F. Baranowski, 34 Oneida Street, speech instructor at Nazareth and director of that college's dramatic program for the past year was named Director of Dramatics for both colleges. The combined groups will offer one play in the fall at St. John Fisher and one in the spring at Nazareth College.

Baranowski graduated from the University of Rochester in 1957 with Phi Beta Kappa honors. He has been active for many years in local theatrical groups and is presently president of the Catholic Theatre of Rochester.

Everybody First Class

Fort Worth — (NC) — The substantial conversion of Negroes to the Catholic faith must be attributed to the fact that "there are no second-class Catholics," according to an article in the October issue of Sepia, leading Negro magazine published here.

The author, John Howard Griffin, who gained wide attention last year by disguising himself as a Negro and traveling through the South, noted that more than 11,000 Negro converts were received into the Church last year. He reported there now are 615,954 Negro Catholics in the U.S., one of every 24 Negroes.

He recalled that when Lauran Cardinal Rugamba, Bishop of Buloba, Tanganyika, became the Church's only Negro Cardinal "the action was hailed as though it represented some change in the Church's attitude—something new." Griffith continued: "This is not true at all. The Church has been universal to the point of paying no attention to race and this is true over the centuries. Few people realize that three popes — Victor, Melchisedes and Gelastus — were African. At least 20 Negro men and women have been canonized and declared saints by the Church."

Lectures Open On Communism

"The Berlin Crisis and the Future of the West" will be discussed by a nationally-known editor and authority on world affairs next Friday, Oct. 13 at St. John Fisher College.

The Rev. Robert A. Graham S.J., associate editor of America, national Catholic weekly review, will analyze the Berlin problem during a 10:30 a.m. lecture at the college. The public is invited.

A native of San Francisco, Father Graham has been a member of the editorial staff of America since 1943. He has specialized in the field of world affairs, especially as they relate to peace and the position of the Catholic Church.

In 1939, his book Vatican Diplomacy, was awarded the John Gilmory Shea Prize of that year by the American Catholic Historical Association.
