College Nun To Speak At Joe Berg Seminar

Sister Jane, S.S.J., Nazareth College instructor, will speak on the topic, "Philosophy and the Natural Sciences," at the third meeting of the Joe Berg Foundation Science Seminar of the Catholic High Schools of Rochester, Tuesday, Oct. 10, at Our Lady of Mercy High School.

THE SEMINAR, which is in its third year of operation, is composed of approximately thirty-five specially selected sophomores, juniors and seniors from Rochester's five Catholic high schools.

It is under the supervision of Sister Mary Edward of Mercy High School and Mr. Charles Zimpfer, S.J., of McQuaid.

The program committee consists of scientists from local industries and the University of Rochester, and includes Sister Edward and Mr. Zimpfer. Members of the program committee are Dr. James E. Koller, Eastman Kodak; Dr. C. J. Terhaar, Eastman Kodak; Miss Helene Donnelly, Kodak Park; and Dr. M. A. Acitelli, Bausch and Lomb.

Officers of the group are Bob Patrie, Aquinas, president; Tom Sauer, McQuaid, vice-president; Nancy Neary, Mercy, secretary; and Pat Shannon, Mercy, assistant secretary.

The seminar normally meets in the science rooms of Mercy High School on Tuesday evenings from 7 to 8:30 p.m. Following last year's procedure, the program this year will consist of a series of five-week projects interspersed with individual speakers.

THE PROGRAM for the first semester with an organizational meeting, Sept. 26, conducted by Sister Mary Edward and Mr. Zimpfer. On Oct. 3, Dr. I. Feldman of the U. of R. spoke on "Theories of Molecular Structure."

From Oct. 17 to Nov. 14 the first cycle will offer the following subjects: Geological History of the Genesee Valley, Astronomy in Practice and Botany. From Nov. 21 to Dec. 19 the second cycle will include: An Introduction to Thermodynamics, Air Pollution and the Human Lung, and Light and Chemistry.

During each cycle, groups of a dozen students each spend the entire five weeks studying each of the three subjects. Work on each of the project studies is supervised by a project leader who may be assisted by other individuals of his own selection. The cycle may also include field trips and the conduction of experiments, according to Sister Mary Edward.
