Aquinas Routs Fallon Meets Jamestown Tonight

Unbeaten Aquinas, sparked by a three touchdown outburst in the first quarter and a tenacious defense, rolled over Bishop Fallon of Buffalo, 48-7, last Sunday.

A HOME OPENING day crowd of 8,168 fans at Aquinas Memorial Stadium last Sunday afternoon saw halfback Jim Mahar race 51 yards to score on the second play of the game.

Fullback Jerry Gears registered two touchdowns for Aquinas in the first quarter on runs of 34 and 23 yards to score his third and fourth touchdowns of the young season.

In the third quarter Jim Mahar and Pete Casartelli began a march which netted them 61 yards but butted over from the end of the quarter. Wayne DeHond, playing the fullback position, raced 12 yards to gain his first of two touchdowns.

Brian Murphy, in the quarterback slot, passed ten yards to Bob Schwab in the final quarter and Wayne DeHond plunged over from the one. The last touchdown came as Murphy hit Pete Seelos who galloped from the seven for the touchdown.

Fallon earned its lone tally in the first quarter on an end run by Vince Sanchez. The Irish offensive display, its best of the season, overshadowed an equally impressive Fallon defensive performance.

Gears turned in the outstanding rushing performance of the day, racking up 145 yards in 11 carries. Jim Mahar was second with 92 yards in 7 carries.

Jamestown, making its first appearance on an Aquinas schedule, defeated Dunkirk in its first game of the season, 21-20. According to coach Walter Colburn, his charges "have been waiting for a long time to get a crack at Aquinas."

COLBURN WILL depend upon veteran Tim Mahoney, a 177 pound fullback who is his top rushing performer, and the Neubauer brothers, Gary at center and Barry at guard, who weigh in at 195 pounds.
