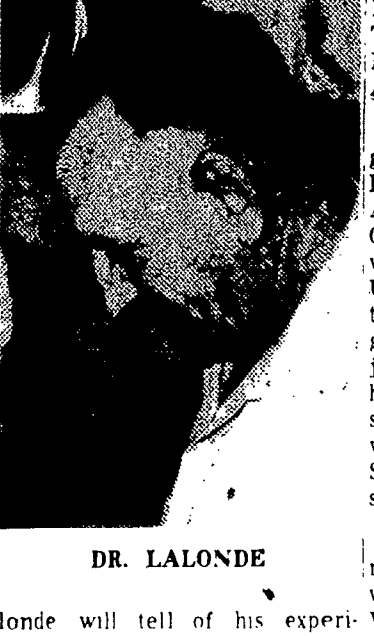
Clyde Unit To Host Deanery Workshop

Pope Cites Generosity To Vatican Radio Station

Castel Gandolfo, Italy — he had visited its studios at Santa Maria di Galleria near Rome. Translations of his message were broadcast in many languages by the Vatican Radio for countries around the world.

After expressing his satisfaction at inspecting the studios for himself, the pontiff said he had gone there to see "these great aerials of modern science which stand thickly together like a forest, raising to the sky at their very tops the Cross of Christ."

His other purpose, the Pope declared, was to "render due homage to his predecessors, Pope Pius XI and Pope Pius XII, who had inaugurated the Vatican Radio as "an aid to the work of the apostolate."

Still another reason for his visit, Pope John stated, was to thank all the members of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits) and their technical assistants "who in this way collaborate in the spread of the Gospel" Director of the Vatican station is Father Antonio Stefanizzi, S.J., a one-time student at Fordham University in New York.
