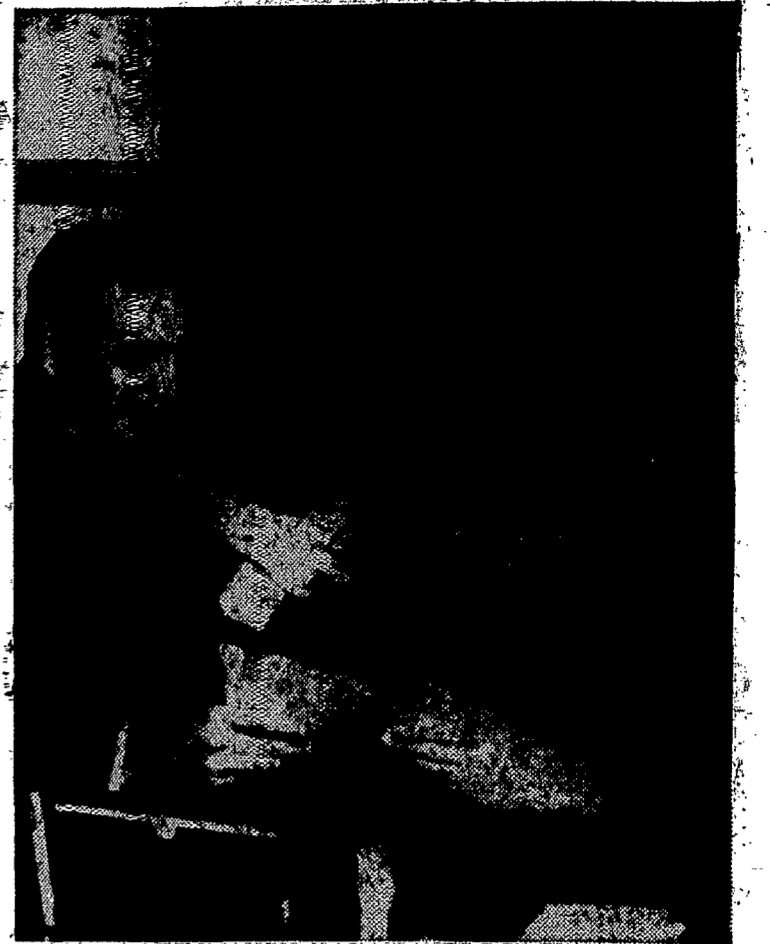
### 'Verein' Units Set Conclave
