

### New Ceramics At St. Pius X

FOUR FIGURES of glazed terra cotta are now over the altar of St. Pius X Church. The figures are the work of Felix Oudin, a well known sculptor of Paris. An exhibition of his works was seen by Father Murphy during a visit in Paris in 1960. They represent two children making their First Holy Communion, and below the figure of St. Pius X is his coat of arms. The group weighs about 600 pounds, and in mounting them, the members of the parish used care to cement the hooks that support them in the wall.




