Booths designed to entertain the whole family will be present.

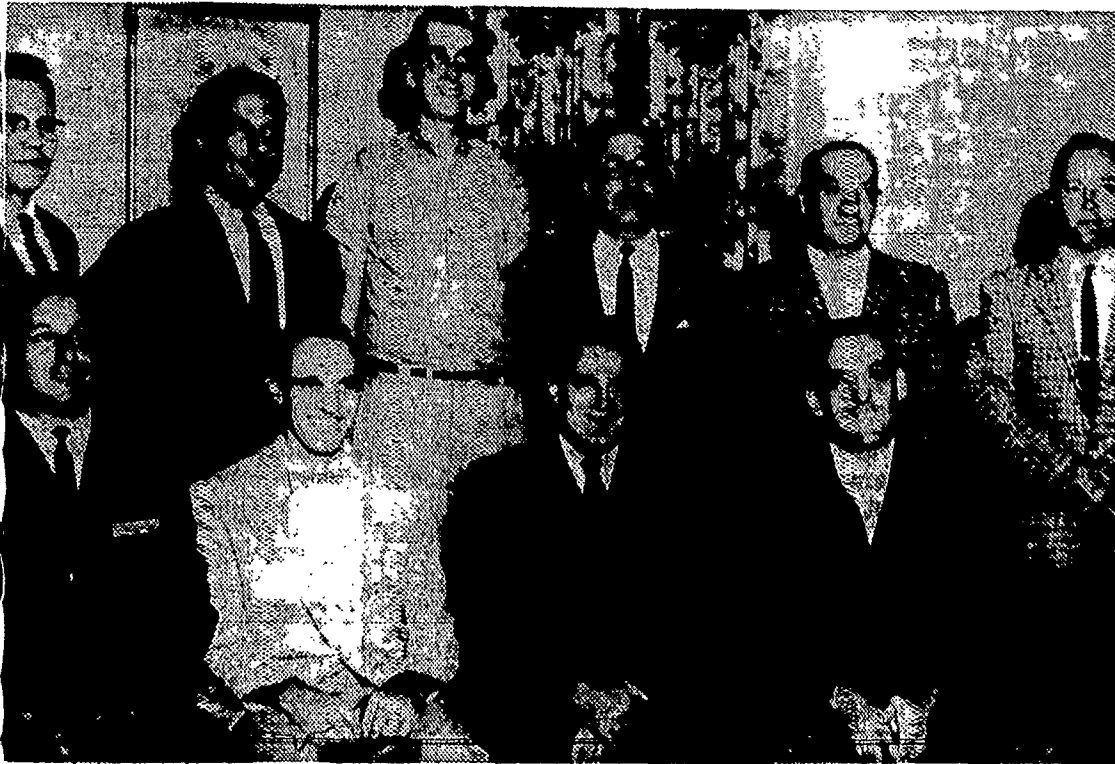
Tickets for the supper can be purchased in advance or at the door.

Mrs. Benedict Messner, the president of the Alumnae Association will preside at the meeting which will follow.

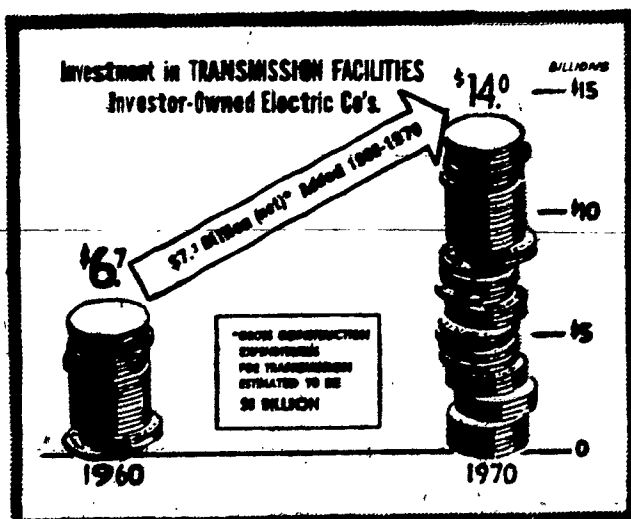

How Much Is \$8,000,000,000?

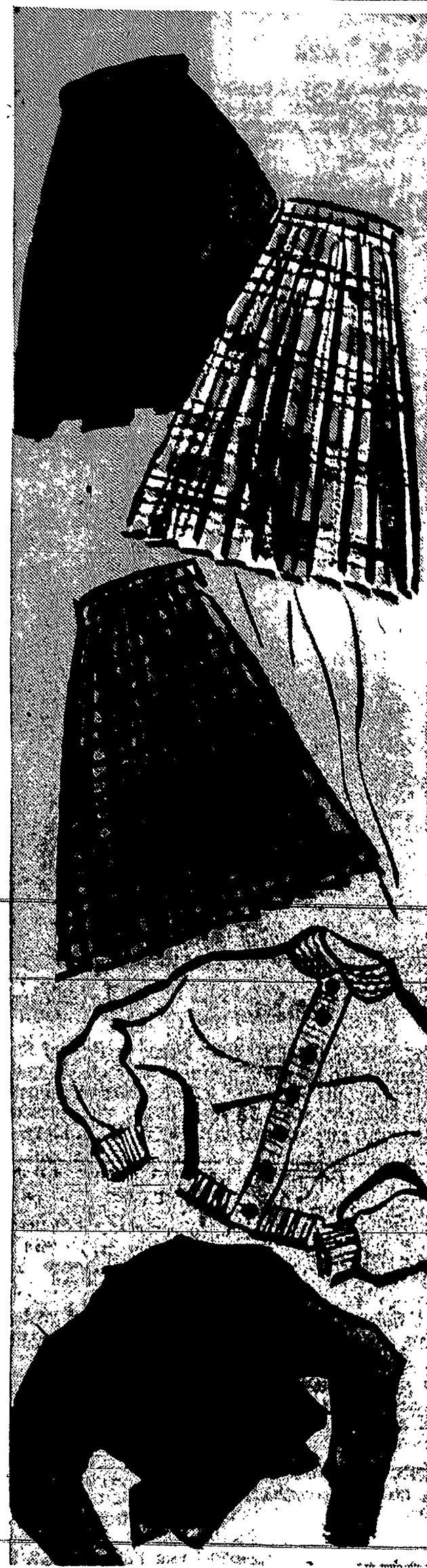
