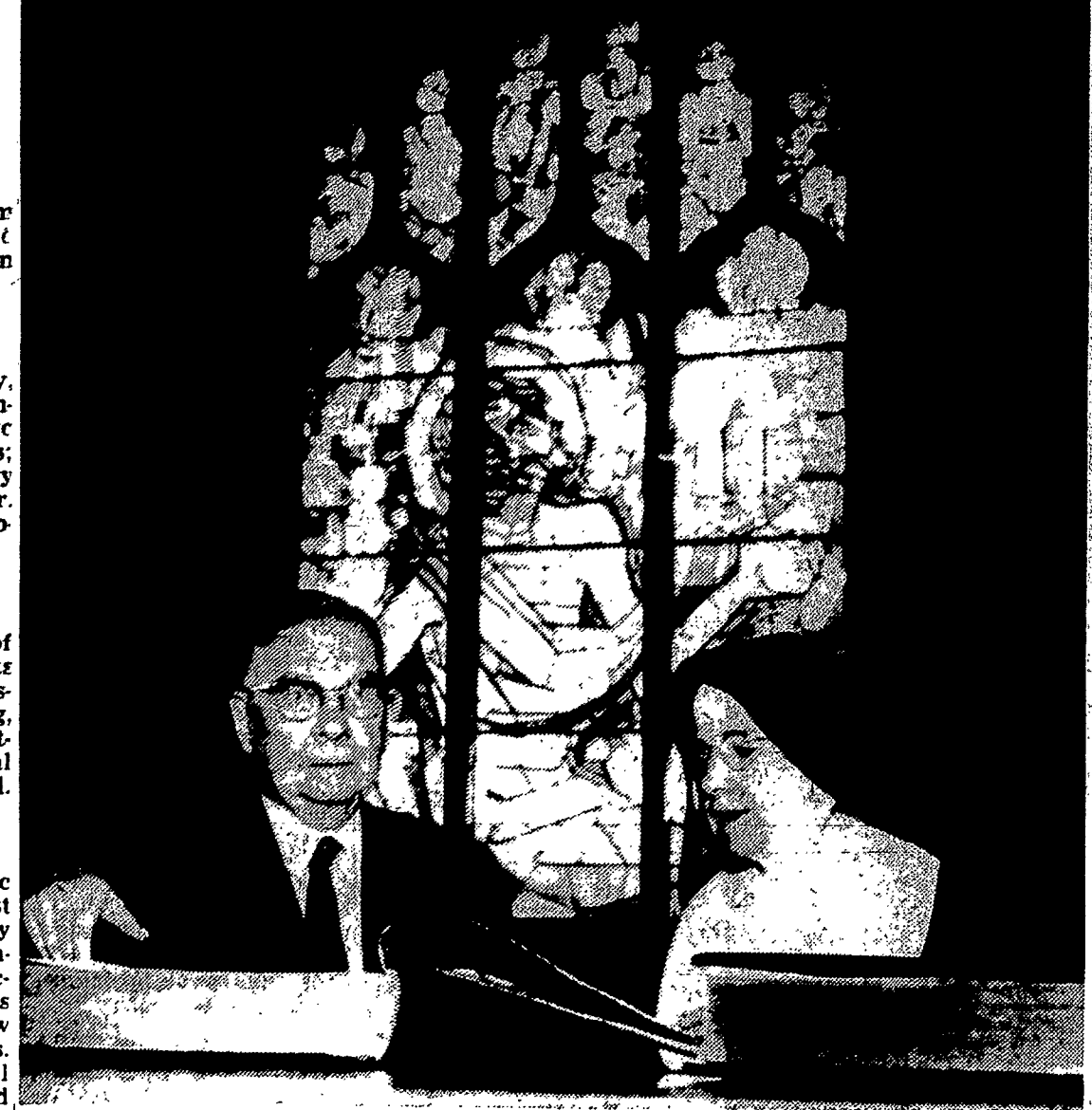

Nazareth College Given To Honor Missionaries Gutenberg Facsimile

A copy of the facsimile edition of the most prized book in the world, the Gutenberg Bible, is now part of the library collection of Nazareth College. The reprint, one of a very limited edition of Gutenberg's 42-line Bible, was originally printed at Mainz on Gutenberg's newly invented printing press sometime between 1450 and 1455.

THE BOOK was given to the college by J. Arthur Jennings of 542 Rock Beach Road, a Rochester attorney. In accepting the gift, Sister Helen Daniel, president of the college said:
