



## Solemn Requiem Held For Sister Bernard Schell

Requiem Mass for Sister M. Bernard Schell of the Congregation of the Sisters of St. Joseph was offered at Nazareth Convent, Pittsford on Tuesday, Oct. 17.

Sister Bernard, who taught at De Sales High School, Geneva, for almost 40 years, died Saturday, Oct. 14, 1961 in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira.

Sister Bernard had been assistant librarian at Nazareth

Academy for the last several years.

Born in Leutkirch, Germany, Sister Bernard came to the United States in 1897 to join the St. Joseph community. She taught biology, chemistry and German at DeSales. Before going there in 1917, Sister taught at St. Francis Xavier and Our Lady of Perpetual Help, Rochester, in Auburn and Webster.

Surviving are three brothers and a sister in Germany.

## Most Grads In College

A post card survey of McQuaid Jesuit High School's most recent graduating class reveals that 87.6 percent of the graduates are continuing their education. Of that group, 62 percent are enrolled in Catholic colleges and universities, with St. John Fisher leading the list.

**THIRTY-THREE** McQuaid graduates are now freshmen at St. John Fisher, six of them at LeMoyne and St. Bonaventure, five at Niagara, and four each at Dayton, St. Michael's (Toronto), and Fordham.

Eleven are enrolled at U. of R. and 8 at R.I.T. These, along with six at U. of Buffalo, comprise the majority of those studying at non-Catholic institutions.

Schools as distant as St. Thomas Aquinas in Houston, Texas; Xavier of New Orleans, Colorado School of Mines, and New Mexico State are also represented on the list prepared by McQuaid principal Rev. Cornelius J. Carr, S.J.

## Editor Reports On Problems In Near East

I. L. Kenen, executive director of the American Israel Public Affairs Committee and editor of Near East Report, spoke at St. John Fisher College last Tuesday on problems of the Near East.

**KENEN HAS** held many key posts in the American Jewish community, among them secretary of the American Jewish Conference.

In that position he organized Jewish delegations to the United Nations Conference in San Francisco, to the Paris peace conference, and other such gatherings.

When the United Nations took up the Palestine question in 1947, Mr. Kenen was the Director of Information for the Jewish agency's delegation. In 1948, he was invited by the government of Israel to join its first UN delegation.

A former newspaperman and lawyer, Kenen was one of the founders of the American Newspaper Guild in Cleveland in 1933. He won the Newspaper Guild's Heywood Brown Memorial for outstanding journalistic achievement. He now resides in Fairfax County, Virginia.

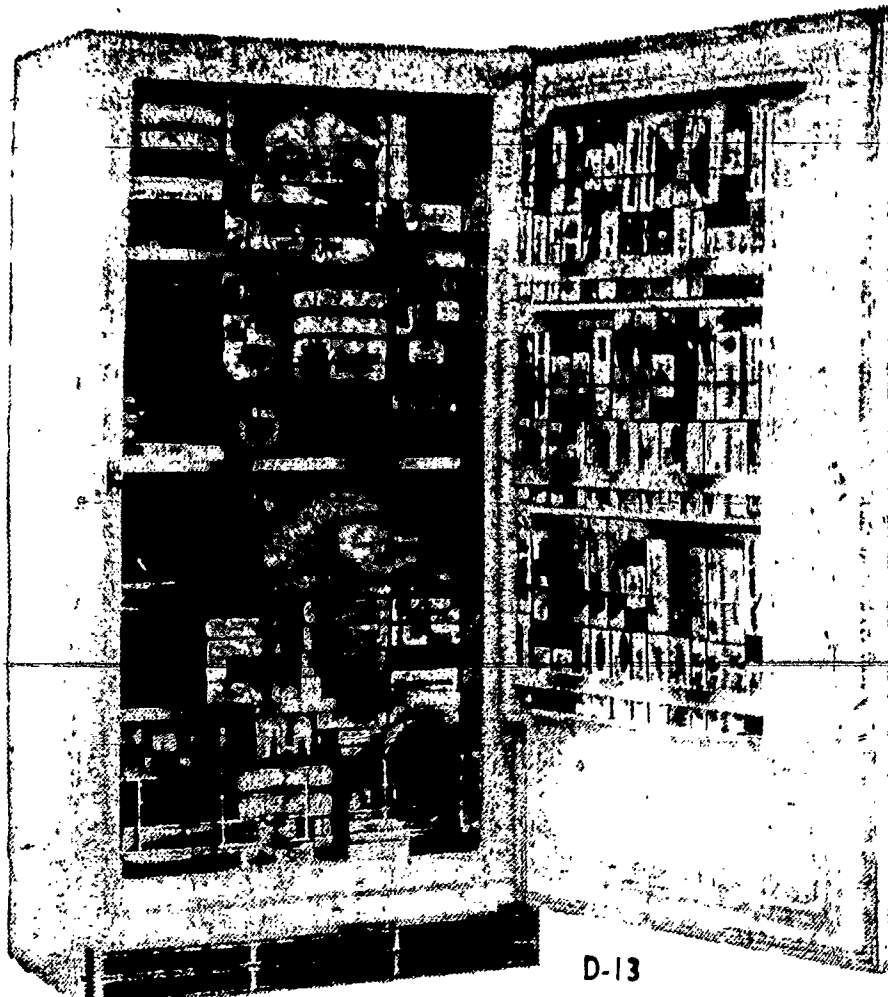
