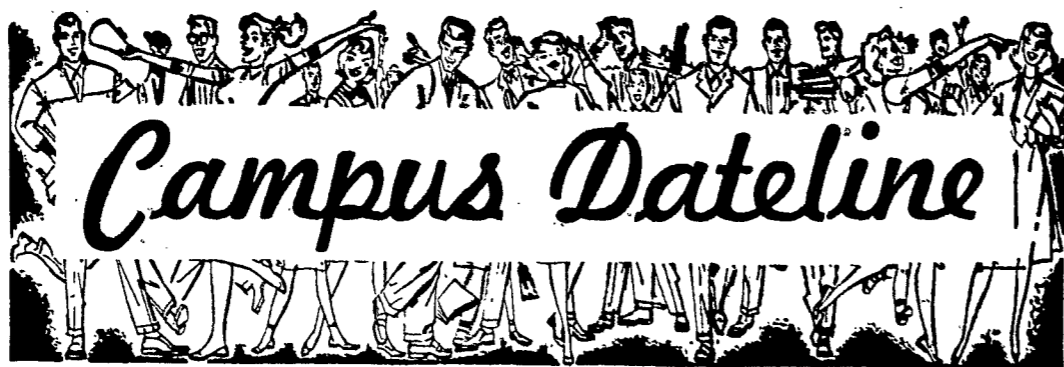


Steel Company's Union Rewarded
