### House 'Detective' Can Find, Arrest Budget Robbers

Proper home maintenance is one of the most important aspects in the economies of home owning today.

Heating fuel is too costly to be wasted. Labor costs for major repair jobs — often the result of neglect — are high. Even a leaky water faucet can waste dollars worth of water if it is ignored for long.

New washers eliminate water waste, and a fresh coat of paint can protect exposed surfaces against severe winter weathering.

Among the major causes of excess heat loss are insufficient insulation and the lack of storm sash and doors. Accessible areas such as attic floors, the ceiling and wall of an attached, un-heated garage can be insulated easily by the home owner with batts or blankets of mineral wool. Other wall and ceiling areas can be filled with mineral wool by a contractor with equipment that blows insulation into enclosed places.

Storm Sash Vital  
Combination storm and screen doors and windows of ponderosa pine can be purchased from building material dealers in sizes to fit all requirements.

A properly insulated house with storm sash and doors can be heated for as much as 50 per cent less per year than a house insulated to minimum FHA requirements without storm sash and doors.

### Dutch Priest To Attend Protestant Council

Leyden — (RNS) — The choice of a Dutch priest as one of the five official Catholic observers at the World Council of Churches' forthcoming Third Assembly at New Delhi, India, caused general gratification among Catholics throughout this country.

Particular satisfaction was felt over the fact that the Dutch nominee, Father Jan C. Groot, 53-year-old professor of the Catholic seminary at Warmond, near there, is recognized as a leading authority in the field of Catholic-Protestant relations.

Father Groot is the representative of the Netherlands hierarchy in ecumenical matters and is the author of a widely praised book analyzing the voluminous writings of Dr. Karl Barth, world-renowned Swiss Protestant theologian. He has been in constant touch with Protestant scholars, especially on the university level.

THE PRIEST is president of the St. Willibrord Association, a group which coordinates the activities of various Dutch societies and secular institutes working in the field of the modern apostolate. Of late, the association has also been especially active in organizing meetings between Catholic and Protestant theologians in the interest of better intercreedal understanding.

Father Groot also is president of the Dutch Catholic Bible Society which was established early this year in Utrecht with the help of Protestants. In former times, Charles Reynolds, current Archbishop of Utrecht, named Administrative Assistant to the President, Eugene Biselli, formerly assistant in the Cost Department was named Assistant Director of Planning and Estimating and Administrative Assistant to the Executive Vice President.

Other changes include Victor Falumbo, newly named Supervisor of Quality Control and Robert Burns, named forman of the Stereotyping Department.

## Sainthood For Nazi Victim?

Padua — (NC) — The beatification cause of Father Maximilian Kolbe, who gave his life to save that of a fellow prisoner in a Nazi concentration camp, has taken a major step forward with the opening of the apostolic process of the cause here.

The apostolic process, which is the more important of the two complete investigations of a proposed saint's life, was opened by Bishop Girolamo Bortignon, O.F.M. Cap., of Padua in late September.

Padua — (NC) — The beatification cause of Father Maximilian Kolbe, who gave his life to save that of a fellow prisoner in a Nazi concentration camp, has taken a major step forward with the opening of the apostolic process of the cause here.

THE APOSTOLIC process is conducted directly by officials of the Sacred Congregation of Rites and is begun only by authorization of the pope.

Ordained in 1919, Father Kolbe returned to Poland where he founded the Militia of the Immaculate Conception, a pious association dedicated to spreading devotion to Mary Immaculate through the press, radio and other publications. A second militia center was established through his efforts when he was a missionary in Japan from 1930 to 1936.

He returned to Poland in 1939 and was arrested by the Nazis less than a month after the outbreak of World War II. He was released for a time but was rearrested in February, 1941. He was held first at the Pawiak concentration camp and then later transferred to Oswiecim (Auschwitz).

When a prisoner escaped from the latter camp, the German commandant ordered 10 men to die by starvation. One of the men chosen, Franciszek Gajowiczek, was the father of a family. Father Kolbe volunteered to die in his place and was permitted to do so.

The 10 prisoners were shut up in a windowless cell. After two weeks, Father Kolbe, who had led his fellow prisoners in Rosaries, hymns and prayers, and three of them survived. They were ordered killed with an injection of phenol.

The ordinary canonical processes for his beatification were begun in Padua on May 24, 1947. The results of these investigations were submitted to the Holy See in 1952, after examination of witnesses and collection of material in Poland, Italy and Japan.
