

## Festa To Benefit Italy Migrants

An Italian buffet — a "festa" aimed at supporting the American Committee on Italian Migration in its efforts to reunite thousands of unfortunates with their loved ones here — will be served from 1 to 5 and from 6 to 9 p.m. Sunday in Immaculate Conception hall, Rochester.

**BISHOP KEARNEY** and Auxiliary Bishop Casey are honorary chairmen of the "festa." In a message to the faithful of the Diocese, Bishop Kearney emphasized the charitable nature of the American Committee's program.

"Many of you do not know and cannot possibly believe that thousands of people in our Diocese and throughout our land are separated from their dear ones living in other countries on account of artificial immigration barriers," he said.

"Spouses yearning to be with their spouses, children begging to be with their parents, parents eager to join their children, sons and daughters, brothers and sisters," he con-

tinued, "they have all been for years waiting and praying to be reunited with their kin-folks in our blessed land."

A total of 170,000 aliens are separated from their close relatives, and most of them are Catholics, the Bishop pointed out.

## Eastern Rite Mass Dramatizes Unity

November 14 evening Mass at St. Charles Borromeo Church, Greece, will symbolize bonds of unity linking eastern rite Christians with western Latin rite.

On the eve of an international meeting of Protestant and Orthodox leaders in New Delhi, India, to explore possibilities of religious unity, proof that east and west are linked in the Catholic faith will be dramatized in a ceremony at St. Charles Borromeo Church, Greece.

Eastern rite Father James Sarkis tells Mrs. Herbert Hoffer and Father James Wolfe of St. Charles parish that icons (sacred images) used in his ceremony for Holy Mass depict the Blessed Virgin Mary always with her divine Son to teach that devotion to her is rooted in fact she is Mother of God.

## Rochester Redemptorist Writes On Eastern Rite

A Rochester-born Redemptorist, the Rev. Clement C. Englert, C.S.S.R. is the author of the book "Catholics and Orthodox, Can They Unite?" just released by Paulist Press, N.Y.

The paper-back booklet is an explanation in detail of the Eastern Rite Churches and is timely in the light of the forthcoming Ecumenical Council called by Pope John XXIII.

**THE AUTHOR**, Father Englert is a Silver Jubilarian in the Congregation of the Most Holy Redeemer, known as Redemptorists, is professor of Comparative Theology and Eastern Liturgies at Fordham University's Russian Institute. He is also assistant spiritual director of the Ukrainian Catholic Seminary at Stamford, Conn.

By special permission of the Holy See, Father Englert has the rare privilege of belonging not only to the Roman Rite but also to the Byzantine Rite.

He celebrated his Silver Jubilee in Immaculate Conception Church, New York City, with his family from Rochester present last May.

His jubilee Mass was celebrated according to the Byzantine Rite. The Ukrainian seminary's faculty and students provided the sacred ministers and servers. Archbishop Amrose Senyshyn, of the Exarchate of the Byzantine Rite in Philadelphia presided and gave his blessing.

**THE CHOIR** of St. George's Church, Manhattan, 60 strong, mixed voices sang a capella during the one and one-half hour rite. The Rev. Charles Fehrenbach, C.S.S.R. preached. Numerous priests, Sisters, Fordham students and friends who attended, nearly all of the Roman rite, were witnessing for the first time the liturgical splen-

hood chiefly in teaching and lecturing.

**HIS LECTURES** concern themselves especially with Eastern Church topics and problems and the teaching covers principally Latin and Greek, music, modern languages and liturgy. For four years he was professor of New Testament Scripture and Sacred Music in the Redemptorist Seminary at Esopus and was at the same time the spiritual director of the Christian Brothers of Ireland Novitiate and Scholasticate at West Park, N.Y.

Besides his latest book, he is the author of two booklets from The Liguorian Press, "A Guide to Mass in the Byzantine Rite" and "Fashions in Church Vestments." Two of his pamphlets used extensively by study clubs and schools as liturgy-texts produced by the Paulist Press are: "Eastern Catholics" and "A comparison of the Roman and Byzantine Mass."

In the spring of 1953 his new translation of the Byzantine Mass was published by the Fordham Russian Center and is accounted by many authorities, both Catholic and Orthodox, as the best English version ever made. It is entitled "The Byzantine Iturgy."
