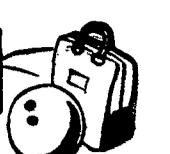

Prelate Goads Spain Reform

Madrid—(RNS)—Much interest has been aroused here by the reprinting of an article in which one of Spain's leading Catholic prelates charged that "the greatest gap in Spanish Catholicism is the deficient development of its social conscience."

It is generally known that General Franco, rather to his surprise and that of other people in his party, was conducted through Seville's poorest quarter by the enterprising Civil Governor, Hermenegildo Altono, and as a result orders were given for the immediate construction of 7,000 workers' dwellings.

Senior Altono is a member of Opus Dei, the Spanish-founded religious institute which, among other things, is vitally interested in fostering Catholicism in the face of backward and depressed conditions prevailing among the workers on their big estates.

Some days later, speaking in Cordoba, General Franco appealed to the good feeling of the Andalusian landowners, "whose properties we saved" (an allusion to the Civil War of 1936-39) to "collaborate with the government in improving the lot of the workers."

Observers here said the government, whether out of conviction or fear of social unrest, have been much impressed by the poverty he witnessed there.

London — (NC) — Members of Parliament, churchmen and other public leaders are joining a new campaign here to check the flood into Britain of pornography from the United States.

Cheap U.S. paperback books with suggestive titles and lurid covers are now common on bookshelves following the loosening of restrictions last year in a sensational English High Court action which decided that the unexpurgated edition of D. H. Lawrence's novel, "Lady Chatterley's Lover," could go on public sale.

The Universe, national Catholic newspaper, has viewed a new smut racket in a story with this headline: "Bid to keep teenagers in vicious circle of filth from U.S."

"A NEW FLOOD of smutty books from the United States," it said, "is being unleashed at Britain's teenagers who are being lured by an exchange racket that keeps them in the grip of unscrupulous book-sellers."

"The books are sold at five shillings (just under one dollar), but if they are returned to the bookshop, two shillings and sixpence (50 per cent) credit is given for the purchase of another book."

A Universe reporter who made a spot check in the industrial city of Manchester found a series of books published in New York on sale at a bookshop in one of the main streets. The books were described as "adult and sophisticated" but the reports charged that the titles and descriptions revealed they were just plain filth.

New World's Oldest Church. Copenhagen — (NC) — Danish archeologists have discovered the foundations of Greenland's oldest Christian church, dating around the year 1,000. The church is believed to be the first built in the New World. Its discovery at Qagssiarssuk, former Brattahlid, is the result of years of search and investigation. It was mentioned in the earliest Norse sagas. It was founded by Tjodhilde, wife of the Norse adventurer Erik the Red. She was buried in its churchyard along with Leif Erikson, often regarded as the first European to touch on the eastern coast of the North American continent. Erik the Red had been exiled from Norway for robbery and murder. He landed in Greenland in 985 or thereabouts, and formed the first small European community there. In 998 Erik sent his son Leif to Norway, where the younger man was baptized through the persuasion of King Olaf Trygvesson. Leif brought the first priests back to Greenland in the spring of 1,000.
