Cayuga County United Appeal 'Over The Top'

Auburn — Cayuga County's 1962 United Community Appeal went "over the top" this week.

Over 1,000 volunteer workers gathered at Mount Carmel High School saw the victory banner raised at 101 per cent of the campaign's \$349,986 goal. THE STEP BY step march to the \$352,058 victory was recorded department by department. This represents 105 per cent of the amount raised last year.

Industry, Finance and Commerce turned in \$9,152,150, 90 per cent; Service \$28,902,311, 98.5 per cent; Small Business \$3,586,101, 121 per cent; Neighborhood \$4,146,051, 107 per cent; Special Gifts Neighborhood \$5,377,001, 101 per cent; County \$53,215,321, 104 per cent; Advance Gifts \$116,328,051, 100 per cent.

The crowd, which broke into applause when Major Films strong showing of \$131,355.13, or 101 per cent of quota, was announced, gave a standing ovation to General Campaign Chairman, Dr. Paul E. Newman.

This was the third consecutive oversubscription of a United Fund campaign and the most amount of money ever raised in the organization's 39-year history.
