ANTHONY ON OVERTIME—vulgar profiteer who secretly plans to make it a Country Club in a development. The Rose Grieco—not the gentle disciple of St. Francis but the hard bargaining intercessor of the modern cult who, although the humble Paduan discounted all material possessions, is incessantly opportunistic as a Lost and Found Department.

New Type N. American

Cuernavaca — (NC) — A Brazilian archbishop who has taken a leading role in social welfare programs has hailed the appearance of a new type of North American, sensitive to the needs of Latin America.

"We must thank God for this new type of North American who is cropping up all over," Auxiliary Archbishop Helder Pessoa Camara of Rio de Janeiro said at the Center for Intercultural Formation here.

Known in Brazil as the "poor man's bishop" for his efforts on behalf of the underprivileged, he spoke at a ceremony marking the start of the second session of the Center for Intercultural Formation here.

The bishop also disclosed that the SS Yucatan is en route to the stricken capital with 92,016 pounds of dried milk and 90,000 pounds of dried beans from CRS-NCWC warehouses.

IN ADDITION, 225,000 pounds of flour have been loaded aboard the SS Trau in Honduras.

In Wake of Hurricane

Relief Pours Into Honduras

New York — (NC) — The worldwide relief agency of U.S. Catholics has sent thousands of pounds of dried food, clothing and medicines to the British Honduras to assist victims of Hurricane Hattie.

Auxiliary Bishop Edward E. Swanstrom of New York, executive director of Catholic Relief Services-National Catholic Welfare Conference, said that 5,000 pounds of clothing and a thousand pounds of antibiotics from the agency's ware houses were flown from New York to Belize, Honduras, via Miami last Friday, Nov. 3.

Bishop Swanstrom said that CRS supplies already stored in British Honduras are being distributed to the victims of the hurricane. Father M.M. O'Connor, S.J., the Catholic welfare agency's representative in the Honduras, is supervising distribution of these supplies.

The monthly Digest publishes 10 foreign editions in Europe, Latin America and Asia. Two more foreign editions, in Latin America and Asia, are planned for next year.

Eighty-five per cent of the magazine's articles are of general interest, and about 15 per cent of religious interest.

Records On Encyclical Toronto — (RNS) — A 50-minute record has been made by the Catholic Women's League of Toronto to aid in the study of Pope John XXIII's social encyclical, Mater et Magistra (Mother and Teacher). The 12-inch 33 1/3 rpm recording has four sections: Pope John XIII's Rerum Novarum; Pope Pius XI's Quadragesimo Anno and a 1941 Pentecost address by Pope Pius XII; Mater et Magistra in relation to the two previous papal social encyclicals; and questions and answers from Mater et Magistra, dealing with farming, international affairs and other social issues.
