Attend National CYO Conclave In Buffalo

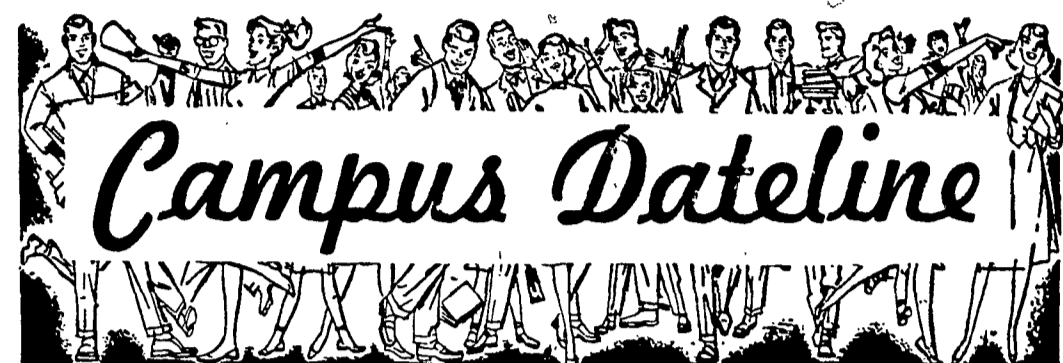
The C.Y.O. Teen Age Committee is official representative of the Diocese at the 6th National Convention in Buffalo, Nov. 9-12. Listed as the largest Catholic Youth Convention ever held, the meeting will draw over 20,000 young adults and teenagers from every state in the union. The young adult section will meet in the 174th army while the CYO teenagers will assemble in the Buffalo Memorial Auditorium.

ROBERT F. KENNEDY, Attorney General of the United States, will be the main speaker for the Gold Ticket Banquet. He will also be the recipient of the 1961 gold Pro Deo Et Juventute Medal. More than 40 teenage panel discussions will be held today at hotels and halls in Buffalo and the Rochester CYO delegation (Group I) will attend many of these panels.

At the convention breakfast on Saturday, the Roches-

ter delegation (Group II) will see Ed Sullivan, Annette Funicello and Dwayne Hickman ("Dobie Gillis").

Rev. Eugene H. McFarland, Diocesan Youth Director, and Howard F. Meath, CYO Program Director, are in charge of the official diocesan delegation. Joseph Judge, Helen Smith (of the CYO staff) and Mrs. Walter Kolb are accompanying the delegation.
