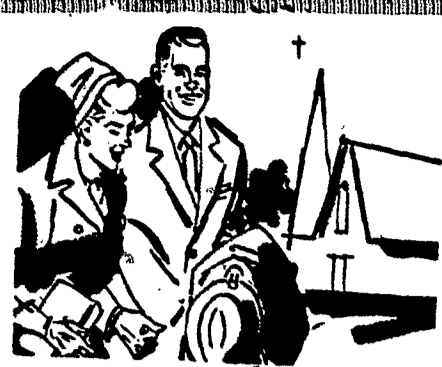

# Missionary Investigation

Jerusalem — (RNS) — Political circles here said there is a strong likelihood that the new coalition Cabinet headed by Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion will appoint a special committee to inquire into Christian missionary activities in Israel.

Demands for an inquiry were made by the National Religious Party, which is represented in the Cabinet. Other parties in the Cabinet include Ben-Gurion's Mapai Labor Party, the *Mithra*—*Teite*—*Achur*—*Avoda* Party, and the small Religious Workers Party.

The issue was brought to a head last summer when Bishop Pier Giorgio Chappero, Roman Catholic Vicar General in Israel, vigorously denied charges that missionary activities are being conducted among Jewish children attending Christian schools in the country. He called for an investigation to disprove the charges.
