'Missa Solemnis' Listed For Eastman Performance

The great "Missa Solemnis" of Beethoven will receive one of its rare performances Sunday, Nov. 19, at 8:15 p.m. in the Eastman Theatre. Theodore Hollenbach will conduct the performance which will be sung by the 300 voices of the Rochester Oratorio Society.

"The Solemn Mass, one of Beethoven's last and greatest compositions, was perhaps the noble fruit of the anguish and suffering occasioned by the composer's total deafness," according to a spokesman.

"The Mass is a musical setting of the Common Parts of the Mass but on a scale so massively conceived that it is never used as an accompaniment for the liturgical celebration.

"The great Catholic composer, Beethoven, gave the liturgical text instead such a grandiose and splendid musical accompaniment that it can only be rendered by a large chorus soloists and symphonic orchestra."

For this Sunday's performance of the Missa Solemnis, the chorus of the Rochester Oratorio Society will be accompanied by the Rochester Philharmonic Orchestra. Several outstanding singers will sing the solo parts: Ilona Kombrink of New York, soprano; David Laurent, of Providence, R.I., baritone; George Shirley, of the Metropolitan Opera Company, tenor; and Betty Allen, of New York, contralto.

Tickets are available at the box office of the Eastman Theatre.

ND Students Honor Pope

Notre Dame, Ind. (RNS) — The University of Notre Dame student body sent Pope John XXIII a huge spiritual bouquet on the occasion of the official celebration of his 80th birthday and the 3rd anniversary of his coronation.

Notre Dame students told the pontiff in a special message that they have offered 9,241 Masses for his intentions. Their spiritual bouquet also included the reception of Holy Communion 8,818 times; the recitation of the Rosary, 6,641 times; and 6,748 visits to the campus Grotto of Our Lady of Lourdes.
