THE THINGS WE TAKE FOR GRANTED

A peaceful change of government in accordance with the results of an election in which we have a part.

The right to meet with one another—whether for political, religious or social reasons.

The right to go to whatever church we wish to, or to no church at all.

The right to say what we like, as long as by so doing we don't interfere with the rights of others.

The satisfaction of knowing that what we own cannot be taken from us arbitrarily by someone stronger than we are, or by the government without adequate compensation.

The knowledge that if we do transgress some of the laws that we have helped to make ourselves, whatever penalty may result from it will be in keeping with the infraction of which we are guilty, and that we can ask for a trial by jury.

These are some of the fundamentals which today we take for granted. Everyone of them is embodied in the first ten amendments to our constitution—the Bill of Rights. But millions of other people are living today who have never enjoyed these privileges our forefathers had to fight to gain. They are too important to be taken for granted.
