He was a member of the Kodak Park Pioneers Club, Park Athletic Association, Society of Photographic Scientists and Engineers and Rochester Society for Quality Control. He was divisional chairman of Kodak Park Foreman's Club.

Mr. Morgan is survived by his wife Kathleen; two sons, Bertrand (Bud) and Ronald; his stepfather, Hardie S. Foster of

Buffalo; a brother, Donald J. Morgan, and a sister, Mrs. John F. McCool.

Basketball Season Opens For McQuaid

Seven seniors will form the nucleus of McQuaid's basketball team when the 1961-62 Knights open their season at Spencerport next Wednesday (Nov. 22).

All of the fourth-year men saw action with last season's squad, which won 14 out of 20 and capped its campaign with the diocesan tournament championship. Two of them — Frank Zona and Tony Criscuolo — were starters a year ago, Zona leading the team in scoring with 270 points and Criscuolo registering 147. The others, all spot players last season but figuring much more prominently now, are John Mooney, Don Robinson, Gerry Rohrer, John Wandtke, and Mike Wojcik.

NINE JUNIORS are battling for the remaining berths on what will likely be a 12 or 13-man squad. Gerry McCabe, Joe Genier, Pete Brockmyre, Bill Bruckel, Jim Carey, Terry Dunlavey, Dick Spies, Dick Updew, and Jan Yutzky make up the third-year brigade of hopefuls, all of them with experience on last year's 14-14 J.V. team.

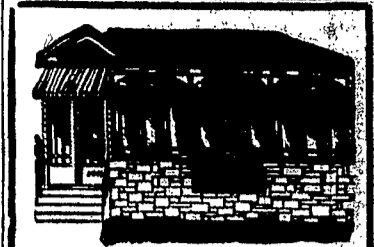
Spies, Bruckel, and Dunlavey are late arrivals from the football squad, which closed shop on Saturday. Five of the prospective squad scale at least 6-2. Criscuolo, Robinson, and Wandtke hit that mark on the nose, Rohrer is 6-3, and McCabe runs 6-4.

ATHLETIC DIRECTOR and coach George Monagan has arranged an 18-game regular season schedule which is marked by a Dec. 22 date with Aquinas at the War Memorial and a Dec. 28 home game against Fordham Prep of New York. The Knights will also defend their diocesan laurels in the annual post-season tournament on March 3.
