### Gideon

On the foundation of the Lawd God" in Green Pastures had a simple benignity that is somehow lacking in Chayefsky's play in spite of Mr. March's majestic presence and sonorous voice. Perhaps it lies in the degree of encircling faith.

In his play Tobias and the Angel, James Bridle made Tobias a coward to show how the Archangel Raphael made a hero of him. Omitting Gideon's demoralization of the cult of Baal, Chayefsky has made his Gideon a numbskull. This offers opportunity for good comedy when Gideon, obeying God's commands to the letter, assembles four tribes and becomes their general.

Faltering but submissive, he is ordered cut down this force by extraordinary methods to three hundred and then with the three hundred and some ingenious God-given strategy he annihilates one hundred and twenty thousand Madianites. After the victory, Gideon becomes restive. True he refuses a crown and says God must be their ruler but he disobeys an order to kill the old man of Succoth who refused to feed his soldiers and finally he dons himself the golden ephod he had made for God and pours off saying that of course the victory was due to natural causes and his own plans. This where the "Angel" of the program was not strong enough for Mr. Chayefsky's thesis because he had to show that even the man who had had his commands direct from God could deny him.

**TYRONE GUTHRIE** is the director of Gideon who is given a wonderfully consistent and amusing characterization by Douglas Campbell (from Ontario) To depict a mountainside, David Hays has designed such a steeply raked stage that the cast have practically to crawl up it. He has provided Gideon's family with a sort of puppet into which they also crawl.

The terrain is so arid and the people so ragged that one wonders what the Madianites found to steal for their own kings who are sumptuously dressed. As usual, Chayefsky's dialogue is terse and effective and succeeds in making a discussion of Man's relationship to God good theatre, if questionable theology. This is the time to reread the story of Gideon (in Judges).

**ALL IN LOVE: THE RIVALS** by Richard Pinsky Sheridan has now entered the list of classics turned musical. The book and lyrics are by Bruce Geller, the music by Jacques Urbant, the smart sets and costumes by Charles Lisabny. The lyrics are amusing, the songs singable, especially when sung by David Atkinson as Jack Absolite and Gavlea Byrne as Miss Lydia Languish. The whole production has vitality and verve.

Mrs. Malaprop's announcement that his "physiognomy is so grammatical" proves that humor can stay fresh for two centuries and some new malapropisms have been found for her song. "A more Than Ordinary Glorious Vocabulary."
