Bacon, left of the original group of 50, Dansville Council members dined and reviewed the history of the Council's 58 years, on Tuesday, Nov. 21, in the Council Hall. Speakers emphasized the trials and successes over the years and the great amount of effort needed to carry on the various programs.

"THE OLDER members gave us a council, and our own building, and now it is up to the new and younger members to carry on in the future. Therefore, it is imperative that new men be invited to join our ranks and take their places among those who have gone before," said Edward F. Brogan, a 50 year and Honorary Life Member of the Council. The activities were opened by Grand Knight Edwin C. Lauffer Jr., who welcomed the large turnout. Edward T. Burke, Past State Warden acted as toastmaster. In his remarks he urged the need for increased membership, and more active participation in Council affairs.

CYO In The News

St. Helen's School accumulated the greatest number of points in last week's Championship Parochial Elementary School Swim meet, held at the C.Y.O. Pool. Good Counsel School and St. Augustine's School were tied for second place with Holy Rosary School coming in for a close third.

Two hundred five boys, representing 26 parochial elementary schools of Monroe County, entered the qualifying rounds of this annual tournament. Of these, 52 boys qualified in the semi-final round, thus entitling them to enter this Championship Meet.

Swimmers, who achieved success and representing St. Helen's School, were as follows: Jeff Atwood, Douglas and Thomas Lennox, Jack Farman, Gene Atwood. The accumulative score of these boys was 43 points, which made them undisputed champions.

OUTSTANDING in the diving competition was Don Totscher of St. Salome, who won first place with 49 1/2 points, second place: John Keele of Holy Rosary; third place: Tom Lennox of St. Helen's.

Individual trophies were presented to all first, second and third place winners, and the boys accumulating the greatest number of points from a represented school was determined Champion. This particular phase of the C.Y.O. program is one of the many annual events prepared by the C.Y.O. Staff and personnel and offered to the Monroe County Parochial School children in the three years that this event has been offered. Participation has grown from approximately 50 boys to this year's 203.

Adding as officials in this meet were Vincent Natale, Director of Men and Boys' Swimming Program, and C.Y.O. director of the meet, Dave Stoll, chief timer. William Kandley, judge of diving and chief starter. This year, for the first time, the C.Y.O. had the assistance of the Water Safety Aids, who acted as timers, judges, and supervisors. They were Richard L. Don and Louis Pellegrino, Paul Ferante and John Gould.
