

Sr. Rose Agnes Requiem Held

Funeral services for Sister Rose Agnes Sereno of the Sisters of St. Joseph, who died in St. Joseph's Hospital, Elmira, Christmas morning after a long illness, were held Thursday morning, Dec. 28, at Nazareth Convent, Pittsford.

Sister died Dec. 25, 1961.

SOLEMN REQUIEM Mass was celebrated by the Rev. Donald J. Mulcahy, assisted by the Rev. Albert H. Schnacky, deacon, and the Rev. William Roche, sub-deacon. At the grave, Rev. Albert Schnacky gave the last blessing, assisted by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Joseph H. Geffell and Rev. Stanislaus B. Krolak.

A native of Rochester, Sister Rose Agnes entered the Sisters of St. Joseph in 1931. She was a supervisor at St. Ann's Home for eight years and at St. Joseph's Villa for five years. Illness forced her retirement in 1955.

Surviving are three brothers, Joseph, Angelo and Sam Sereno, also two sisters, Mrs. William Swanson and Mrs. Russell Oldfield, all of Rochester.
