Top Red Leader Now Catholic

New York — (NC) — John Lautner, a top official for 20 years of the Communist party in the U.S., was received into the Church in November, 1961, the Oriel Society announced here.

The society, an international Catholic cultural organization, said (Jan. 7) that Lautner received his religious instructions and First Communion from Father Vincent Hart, S.J., of Loyola Seminary, Shrub Oak, N.Y.

The Oriel Society stated that Father Robert Gannon, S.J., former president of Fordham University, helped lead Lautner into the Church by suggesting that he make a retreat in the summer of 1961 at Loyola Seminary.

Lautner had served as a member of the Communist party's national review commission and as a security officer of the party. He also was assigned to building the party's underground apparatus in New York state.

On January 14, 1950, he was accused of being an FBI agent and tortured in Cleveland by communist thugs. He left the party shortly afterwards. The torture he suffered is described in FBI director J. Edgar Hoover's book "Masters of Deceit."

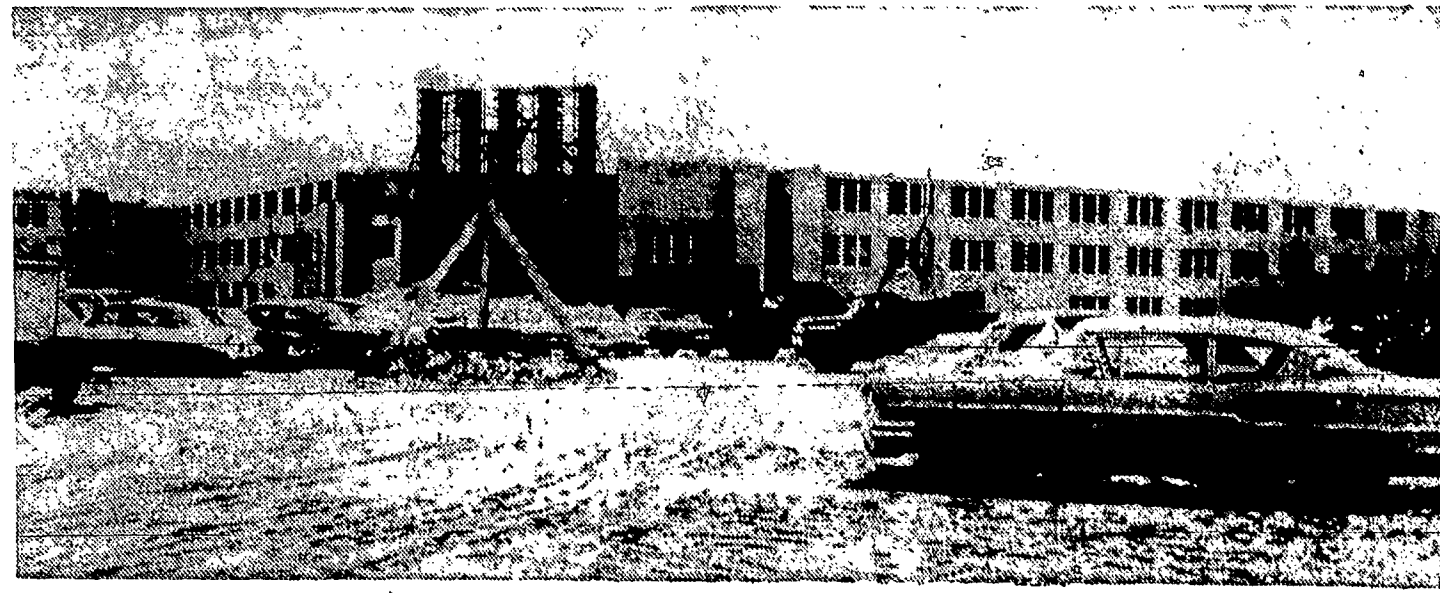
Since leaving the party he has worked closely with the U.S. Government. He is a consultant to the U.S. Department

of Justice and has been a witness for the department in 20 Smith Act conspiracy and Communist party membership cases. He also lectures for the Oriel Society on the techniques and propaganda of communism.

In a recent letter to Lautner, J. Edgar Hoover said: "I have followed your testimony in recent years with considerable interest and you may well take pride in your contribution to the nation's welfare through the part you have played in the Government's efforts to combat the communist conspiracy."

The Oriel Society, composed of leading speakers from the U.S., Europe and the Orient, announced that Lautner will be honored at a reception on January 19 at the Metropolitan Club in New York.

Ten years ago the Oriel Society, through its priest members from the Russian Center at Fordham University, was instrumental in leading into the Church a number of prominent names in the Communist party, Mrs. Hilde Massing. She has served as an international communist courier and was the U.S. Government's star witness in the second trial of Alger Hiss, who was convicted of perjury.

No Teenage Casualty, Boston Priest Credited

Boston — (RNS) — The fact that for the first time in many years not one teenager was killed or involved in a serious highway accident during the Christmas holidays in the Greater Boston area is a source of much satisfaction to a Catholic priest who conceived an unusual road safety plan.

Father Kenneth B. Murphy, curate of St. Francis de Sales church in Boston's Charlestown district, suggested that police chiefs in 140 Eastern Massachusetts cities and towns send letters to parents of youngsters involved in traffic violations.

The plan received widespread publicity in the area and police departments agreed to try it out on a trial basis during the holidays.

Final reports of police chiefs whose municipalities adopted the plan showed that no teenager was involved in a serious mishap. So successful was the program that Massachusetts Gov. John Volpe wrote to Father Murphy, suggesting that the campaign be extended throughout the entire year and given permanent status.

Father Murphy, who organized Rescue, Inc., an organization which has prevented hundreds of suicides, also was praised by Mrs. Edward F. Ryan, president of the Massachusetts Congress of Parents and Teachers, for conducting the campaign.
