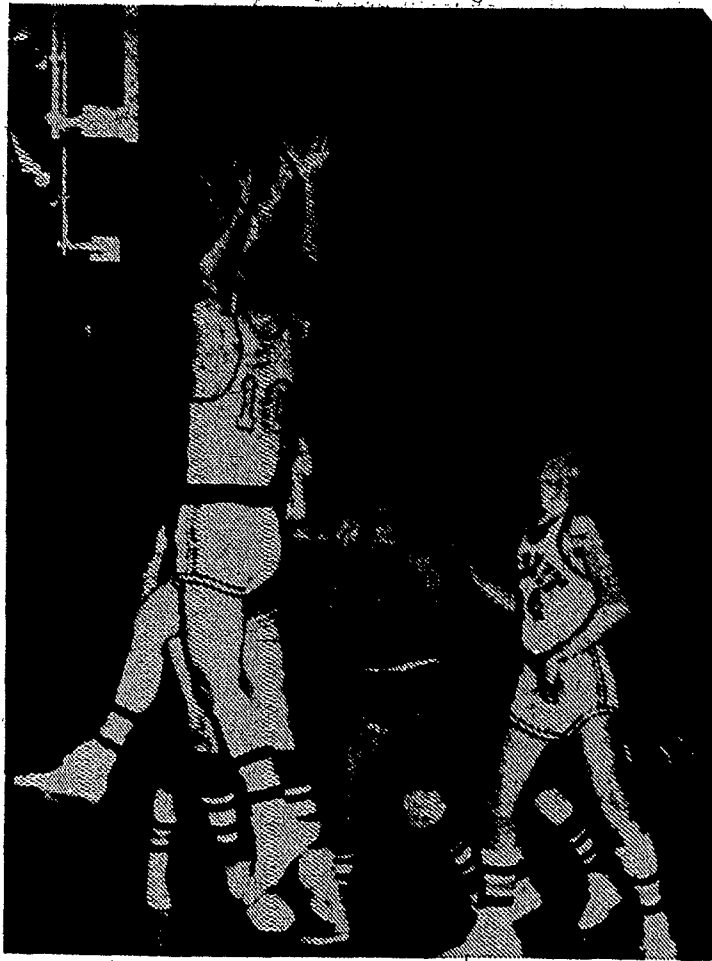


McQuaid Faces Jefferson

Having weathered a stiff challenge from previously undefeated East High last Friday, McQuaid Jesuit High's cagers (5-2) go after a repeat victory over Jefferson at the McQuaid court tonight, Friday at 8 p.m.

Aquinas Institute's basketball team will be shooting for its eighth win of the season tomorrow evening in the Hornell Armory when the Maroon and White meets Hornell High School at 8:15 p.m. with a jayvee game scheduled to begin at 7 p.m.

The Irish notched two victories last weekend by subduing Edison Tech of the city scholastic league, 70-37 on Friday evening and then nipping Bishop Fallon of Buffalo, 68-60, on Sunday afternoon.

With Page leading with accurate shooting and expert rebounding by Norb Keller, Aquinas had three periods.

AQUINAS battled back to tie the final stanza, deadlocking the test at 55-55 on a basket by Chatterton. Bob Schwab put the Irish into the lead a minute later, sinking a free throw. Chatterton, turning in a brilliant performance, dropped in a jumper and Aquinas led the rest of the way.

Final statistics show Aquinas over the visitors throughout the second period, walking off with a 34-30 edge at halftime. Page had 8 points in the first half for Aquinas, which connected on only 13 of 37 first-half attempts from the field. Bishop Fallon, which received a 12-point first half from Joe LoTempio, managed 14 of 34 attempts from the field in the first two periods.
