

## Priest Jailed For Aid To Algerians

Paris — (RNS)—Abt Robert Daveziez, 39-year-old French Roman Catholic priest accused of aiding the Algerian National Liberation Front, was sentenced by a military court to three years' imprisonment and fined the equivalent of \$1,000.

Indicted for "plotting against the security of the state and associating with evildoers," Abbe Daveziez admitted helping 15 Algerians to escape from France to Spain. But he claimed he did not know they were on their way to be trained as terrorists.

THE PRIEST admitted also his sympathy for the Algerian liberation struggle, especially, he said, after he had received letters from a French Army chaplain describing tortures inflicted on Algerians by French soldiers.

One of Abbe Daveziez' defense lawyers, Miss Saunders, an Englishwoman, told the court: "I am sure that the builders of the future will draw a lesson from this trial. Beyond the criminal code and the law there is another unwritten law which must be respected — that of God."

In his last word before sentence was passed, Abbe Daveziez said: "I hate nobody, but I detest war. I was profoundly moved by the Algerian drama. Today, I think, the future is in our hands — a future of peace and fraternity. I am conscious of having failed neither in the field of honor nor of patriotism."

During the trial a letter was read in which Achille Cardinal Lineart, Bishop of Lille, said he was convinced that the priest had acted in a spirit of justice and fraternity and that his acts and intentions could not be judged independently of their context. The cardinal wrote as superior of the Mission de France, a group of worker-priests of which Abbe Daveziez is a member.

### Father Devine Dies

Niagara University — The Rev. William A. Devine, C.M., who served as chairman of the classical languages department at Niagara University from 1942 until his retirement in 1960, died Sunday, Jan. 6, 1962, in Philadelphia. He was 69.

# Tabulation of Laymen's Retreats by Parishes

A total of 3,408 men made retreats at Notre Dame Retreat House, Rochester, in 1961, an increase of 42 over the previous year's number.

The report made by Rev. Michael Downing, C.S.S.R., retreat house rector, at last night's Retreat League Mass in St. Joseph's Church also showed four parishes represented in 1961 for the first time.

880 men made their first retreats during the past year. Highest number from a single parish is 117 from Sacred Heart Cathedral.

Bishop Kearney celebrated the Mass last evening for more than 500 members of the Retreat League organization. Earlier in the week, Masses were said in Geneva and Bath for members in those areas of the Diocese.

## Churches Shared In Germany

Augsburg — (NC) — Catholics in a small Bavarian community who have shared their church with Protestants for several centuries have now donated a cherished cross for the altar in the new church the Protestants are completing.

It happened in the town of Deiningen near here. The gift was accompanied by the comment of the Catholic pastor that, though his congregation found it difficult to part with their cross, they deemed it a fitting gift as a symbol of their deep desire for Christian reunion.

The shared church arrangement with the Lutherans of Deiningen had been in force for 345 years.

Germany has other examples. There, behind the Iron Curtain, a uniquely partitioned Soviet-controlled East Germany is a symbol of Christian unity in the face of godless communism.

In Saxony the Lutherans predominate, and they have secured the right for themselves to use the Meissen Catholic cathedral for their services because they have no local place of worship of their own.

The church has three naves and it is divided in half by a wooden fence which cuts it in the middle. The front section toward the main altar belongs to the Catholics, the other half to the Lutherans. The two groups agree among themselves to choose different hours so as not to disturb one another.

### Near Billion For Churches

Washington — (RNS) — Church construction in 1961 totaled \$984,000,000 according to a preliminary estimate by the U.S. Census Bureau.

Construction put in place during December amounted to \$85,000,000, a seasonal decline of \$4,000,000 from November and \$1,000,000 less than the December 1960 figure, the census agency estimated.

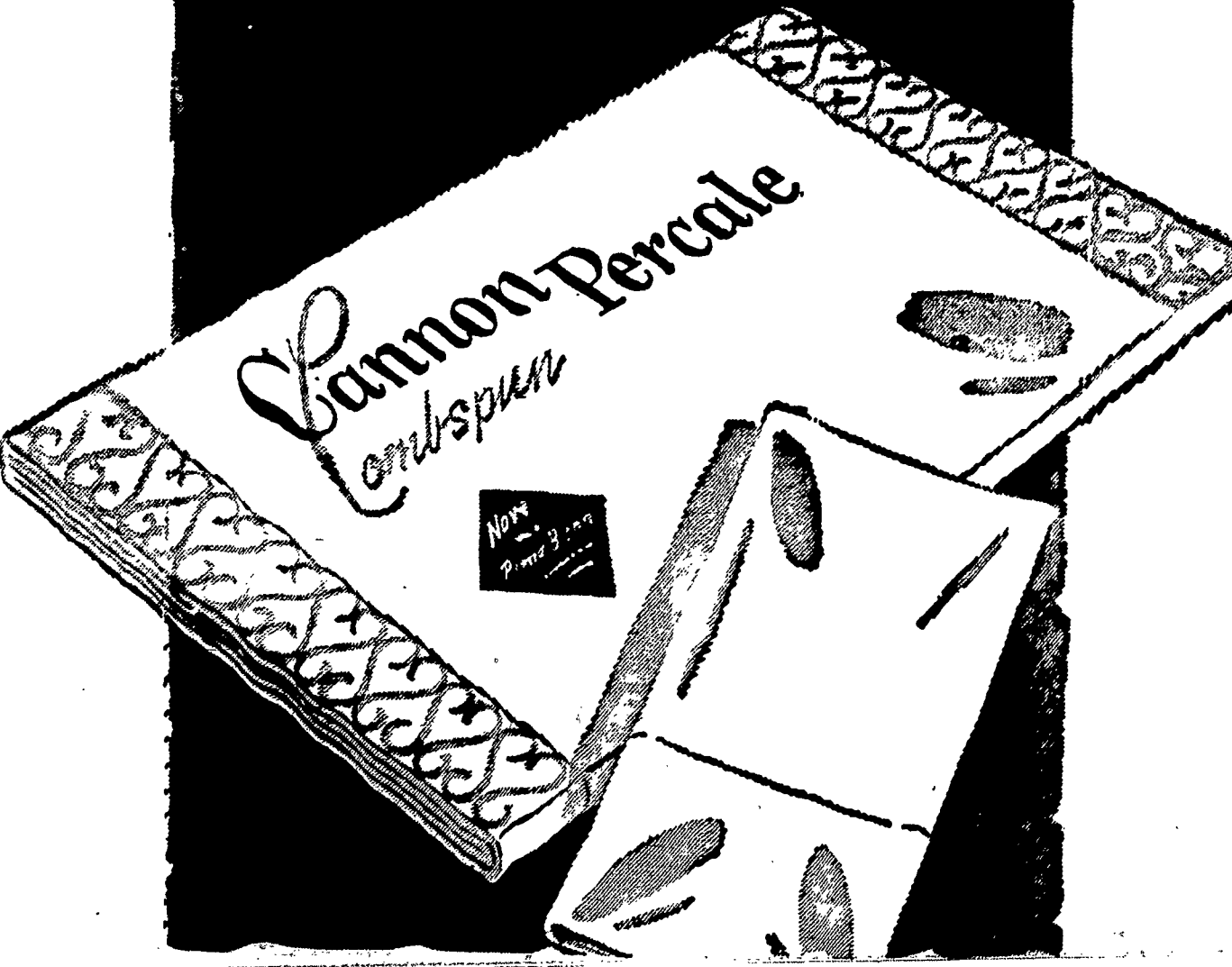

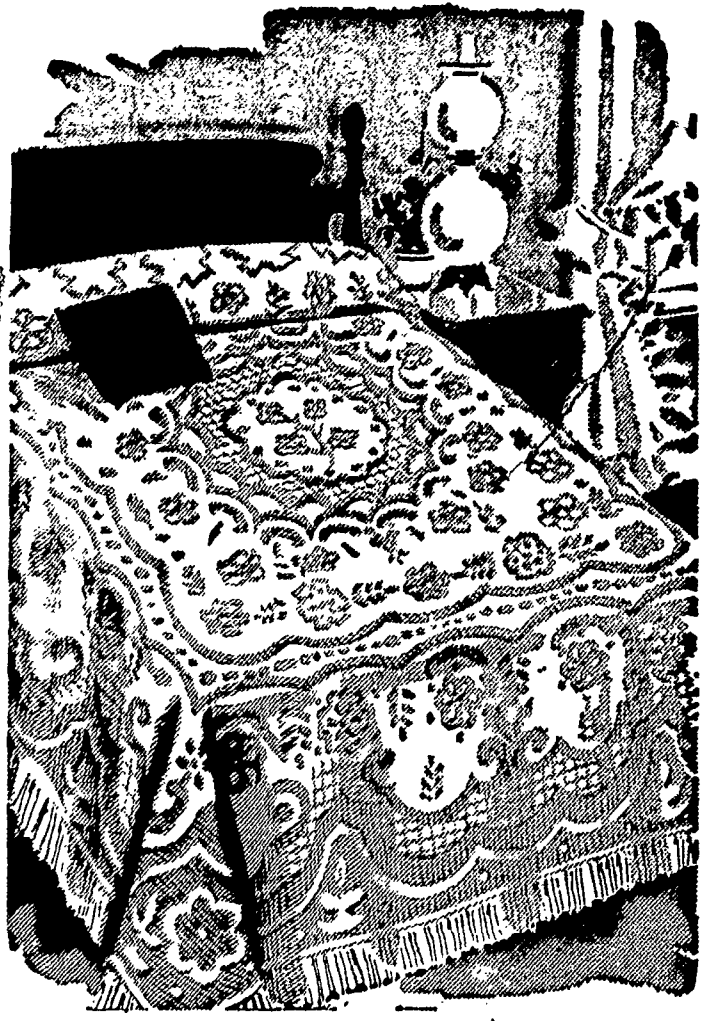
