STATE DEPUTY John F. Symonds will roll the first ball. A team composed of state officers will also bowl that day.

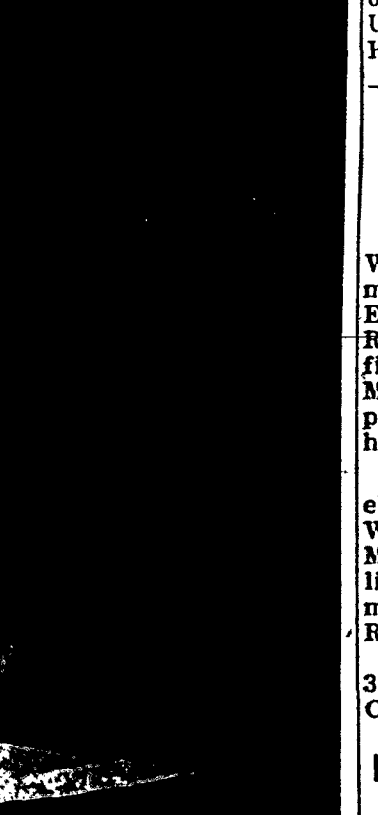
Opening day bowlers will be welcomed by Ithaca's Mayor John F. Ryan.

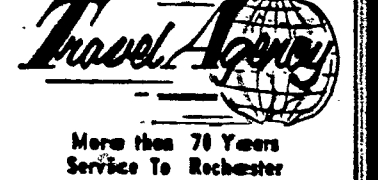
### Watkins Women Choose Slate

It is suggested that couples attend the conferences as early as possible to insure that the whole series will be completed. It is permissible to substitute lectures from various series.

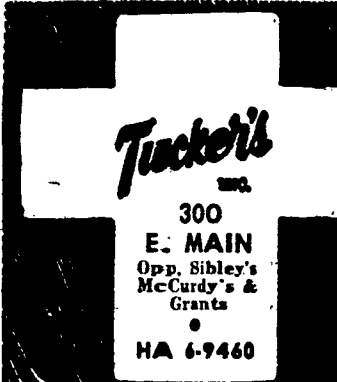

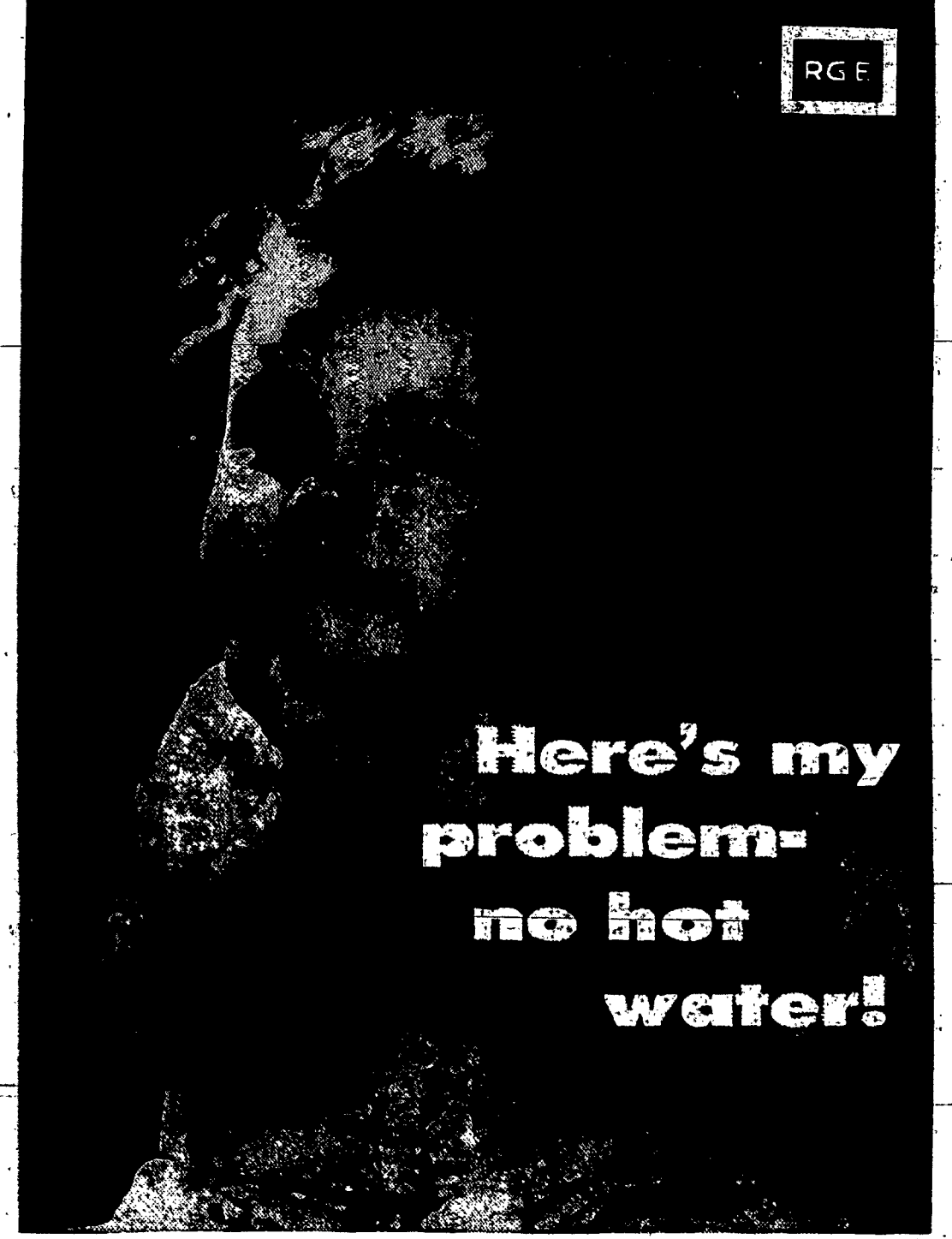
