**NAS Marks 10 Years  
At Blessed Sacrament**

More than 200 men of Rochester's southeast area marked the tenth anniversary of their Nocturnal Adoration Society at Blessed Sacrament Church Thursday, Jan. 18.

National director of the organization, Rev. Hector C. Lemieux, S.S., spoke at the dinner following Mass and Benediction.

He said "the element of sacrifice" in the Society's one-month, hour-long devotion to the Blessed Sacrament was the factor which appealed to men who "want to do something" for themselves, their families and the world in the face of problems which defy human solution.

HE AWARDED certificates to 36 men for perfect attendance in 1961 and encouraged members to remain faithful to their "vigil" — taking a turn for an hour between 10 p.m. and 6 a.m. on the last Saturday of each month.

Monsignor Thomas F. Connors, pastor of Blessed Sacrament, commented, "Father Lemieux gave the most impressive talk on the Blessed Sacrament I have heard in my priestly career" — a span of 63 years. Monsignor Connors celebrated

**Dormitory Loans  
OK'd for Colleges**

Loans totaling \$2,750,000 have been approved for construction of new dormitories at St. John Fisher College and Nazareth College, according to an announce-

ment made this week by the Very Rev. Charles J. Lavery, president of St. John Fisher, and Sister Helen Daniel, president of Nazareth.

Notification of approval of the self-liquidating federal loans was received from the New York City regional office of the U.S. Housing and Home Finance Agency. The money will permit construction of St. John Fisher's 400-bed dormitory for students and Nazareth's 200-bed dormitory.

The \$1 million St. John Fisher dormitory will house 200 students. The Basilian Fathers College now has an enrollment of 600 men, 150 of them from outside the Rochester area.

The \$1,750,000 building to be constructed at Nazareth College will house 250 students and 50 faculty members and contain dining facilities for 300. Sisters of St. Joseph attached to the college faculty now live in the order's Motherhouse on East Avenue. Approximately 280 students are accommodated in the college's two existing dormitories.

Both colleges hope to have the new buildings ready for occupancy in September, 1963.

Father Lavery called the new dormitory construction, "the first stage in a long-term de-
