At Our House . . .

Babes In Church?

Dear Mrs. Daly: What do you think about a young couple who insist on taking their two small children to Mass with them?

They are neighbors of ours and I don't like to say anything about them but, honestly, those children are the most distract- ing element in the church. First baby care, in many large par- ones will crawl all over her mother and father, then make a soundproof room where Mass for the people in the pew ahead and baby sitting can be accom- and the pew behind. As soon as they have her subdued, her brother will start the fireworks. They are about two and three years old. They talk out loud, they point to the priest, make remarks about the "funny man, Mommy" and about "the lady with the big hat."

I KNOW this doesn't sound very Christian, Mrs. Daly, but today I don't feel very Christian. Not when it comes to kids in church.

I have hinted to these neighbors, saying that it must be very hard to get babies up and dressed and fed and then take them out early in the morning. (We live in a small place where there are only two Masses.) However, since there are two Masses, I should think that the parents could take turns baby sitting with the children at home, and let the rest of us pray in peace.

These aren't the only two distract- ors — a lot of other young parents offend the same way — but I must say these are the worst. One time I was so annoyed I spoke to the priest about it but he's a jolly sort and he just laughed and said something about "Suffer the little children. . . ."

That's all well and good but I'll bet our Lord didn't mean that they should disturb a whole congregation.

Did you take your children to church when they were small, Mrs. Daly? If you would write something about it in your column it might do some good, because the mother in question reads your column.

I really like this young couple and their children, believe it or not. The children aren't really bad, but to my way of thinking, THEY DON'T BELONG IN CHURCH.

Please don't use my name or even initials.

Dear Mrs. Name Withheld: Your complaint is not an un- common one. I'm sure you are not un-Christian at all, just one who does not like to be dis- turbed — and that is a state of mind that grows with age.

The saying that "God knew what He was doing when He gave children only to the young" is borne out in your attitude. Certainly the young parents seem adaptable enough to pray in spite of the interrup- tions, just as they manage their

days and nights surrounded by childish intrusions.

EVERY THOUGH there are two Masses, probably the father and mother thoroughly enjoy all too often, though we did try to keep bothersome baby con- duct to a minimum by sitting near an exit and taking along something to keep the baby amused until he or she was old enough to use a small child's missal with pictures of what the priest was doing. A Mass, even a low one, can be a tiring experience for a small child. Perhaps Benediction is a bet- ter introduction to church go- ing. It is short, and children love the music, candles, the motion and the incense.

As for what you can do: I remember so well a neighbor of ours, long since gone to heaven, who volunteered now and then to stay with our children, "so you two can attend Mass to- gether." How we loved her kindness and how the children loved her!

Come to think of it, these many years later, maybe our kids bothered her in church! M.T.D.
