## Civil Defense Training

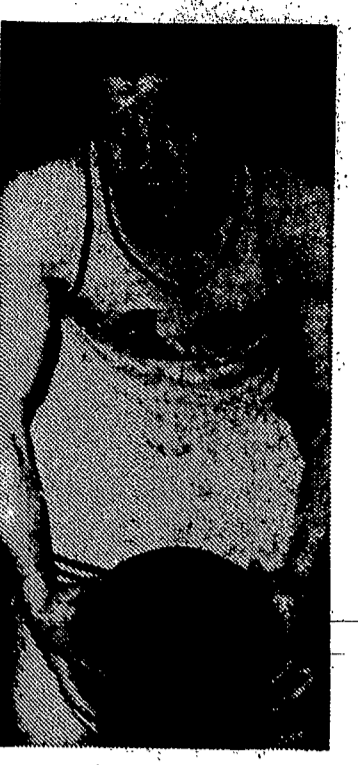

Art Williams, the Utica captain, leads the Jugglers with 202 points in eleven games. His best season effort was a 33-point output against Proctor High. He will have additional scoring and rebounding help from Soph Tom Devins and scrappy John Dillon. Tom Pestorius' 21 points led Aquinas to a 62-44 victory over Hilton's juniors. He received a big assist from Steve Herbert who netted 14 and Don Borzelli who added 10. Next home game for Aquinas will be against Bishop Timon of Buffalo on Friday evening, Feb. 23.
