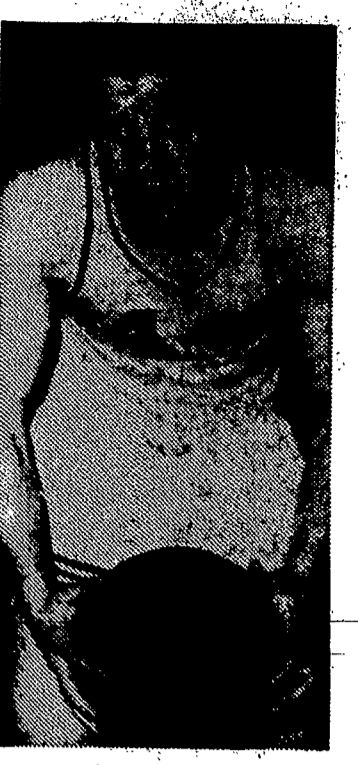

Aquinas Downs West, Seeks Utica Victory

Aquinas Institute, consistently one of the city's leading independent high school basketball powers, once again seems destined for a highly victorious season. The Little Irish polished off West High of the City Interscholastic league 58-41 last Friday evening in 13 games. The following night Aquinas, behind at halftime, defeated Hilton Central School of the county circuit, 59-43, at Hilton.

Coach Ron Mack's charges visit Notre Dame of Utica this Sunday (Feb. 11) and travel to Buffalo the following week to take on Bishop Fallon. Coach Church Steveskey of Notre Dame feels his Jugglers, defending City and Oneida County champions, will avenge their early season loss to Aquinas when the Irish nipped Notre Dame 74-55, thus spoiling their perfect record.

Art Williams, the Utica captain, leads the Jugglers with 202 points in eleven games. His best season effort was a 33-point output against Proctor High. He will have additional scoring and rebounding help from Soph Tom Devins and scrappy John Dillon.

Aquinas will counter with Jim Chatterton, 248 points in fourteen games, and Gary Page with 193 points. Chatterton was top man for the Irish in both the West and Hilton games with 19 points. Chatterton also accounted for 11 rebounds at Hilton and 12 at West.

THE MAROON and White hoopers outscored West High, 18 to 6, in the first period of last Friday's game to set the scoring pattern for the evening. Accurate shooting spelled the difference as the Irish turned in a 53% average, compared to 28% for West.

In the jayvee game, the Irish juniors walloped the Occidentals, 49-27. Steve Herbert and Tom Pestorius paced the visitors with 10 points each and Kevin Barrett added 8.

Last Saturday Aquinas overcame a halftime deficit to defeat Hilton Central, 59-43, in an action-packed game. The Irish roared back in the second half with a fully court press which completely baffled Hilton and forced the Crusaders into numerous mistakes. In the final stanza, Aquinas outscored Hilton, 22-7.

In the jayvee preliminary, St. Patrick's led at halftime 15 to 13 and St. Agnes came along and tied it up at 27 all in the third quarter. The visitors outscored St. Patrick's from the foul line 9 to 4 which proved more than enough for the win.

Other scores for St. Agnes were as follows: Dave Bruckel 6; John Snider, 5; Paul Passomonte 3; Jack Wells and Rick Murphy 2, and Pete Burke 1. For St. Patrick's it was John Beurlein and Don Chichester with 6 apiece and Nick Tennant and Rich Smallwood with 2 apiece.

St. Patrick's will play St. Joseph's of Wayland in a non-league game here Saturday morning. The game scheduled here Saturday between St. Mary's Dansville, and St. Rose, Lima, was postponed due to players from both squads taking entrance examinations at McQuaid High.

Tom Pestorius' 21 points led Aquinas to a 62-44 victory over Hilton's juniors. He received a big assist from Steve Herbert who netted 14 and Don Borzelli who added 10.

Next home game for Aquinas will be against Bishop Timon of Buffalo on Friday evening, Feb. 23.
