## New Cardinals Named

Vatican City — (RNS) — Pope John XXIII named ten new cardinals, bringing membership in the Sacred College to a record 87, representing 32 countries. They will be formally created at a consistory on March 19 bringing to 52 the number given the honor by Pope John.

It is possible that the number of cardinals may go even higher, since the Pope, at the consistory in March, 1960, dis-closed he had named three cardinals "in pectore," which meant that their names were reserved for announcement at a later date.

The ten new cardinals created—three Italians, two Latin Americans, and one each from Ireland, Portugal, Belgium, Syria and Spain—range in age from 48 to 81.

The consistory in March will be the fifth held by Pope John. The first was called in December, 1958, less than two months after his election. He immediately increased the number of cardinals beyond the maximum of 70 that had been in force since the days of Pope Sixtus in the second half of the 16th century.

Following are brief biographies of the ten members of the Sacred College:

**Archbishop Jose Da Costa Nunes**, Vice Camerlengo of the Roman Church, was born March 15, 1880, at Candelaria, Pico Island, the Azores. He was ordained in Macao in 1903 and after nearly 20 years of missionary, teaching and pastoral work was made Bishop of Matriz da Horta, the Azores, in 1921. He was named Archbishop of Goa and Damão, Primate of the East and Patriarch of the East Indies in 1940, and in 1953 was brought to Rome to serve as Vice Camerlengo.

**Archbishop Giovanni Pantico**, Apostolic Nuncio to Portugal, hails from Tricase, near Lecce, southeast Italy, where he was born on April 12, 1895. Four years after his ordination at Rome in 1919, he entered the Vatican diplomatic service. After filling various posts in South America, he was made Apostolic Delegate to Australia in 1935. He was named Papal Nuncio to Peru in 1948, five years later became Apostolic Delegate in Canada, and in 1959 was made Nuncio to Portugal.

**Archbishop Ilderbrando Antonutti**, Papal Nuncio to Spain since 1953, was born in Nimis, in the Archdiocese of Udine, North Italy, on Aug. 3, 1898. After his ordination at Rome in 1920, he was sent to his native diocese to serve as the archbishop's secretary and to teach at the archdiocesan seminary. His career as a Vatican diplomat began in 1927, when he was made third secretary at the Apostolic Delegation in Peiping, China. In 1936, he was consecrated an archbishop and sent as Apostolic Delegate to Alban-

**Titular Abbot Anselmo Albaroda**, O.S.B., of the ancient Abbey of Ripoll in Spain, was born at Barcelona on Feb. 16, 1892. Ordained in 1915, he has been Prefect of the Vatican Library for the past 26 years and is a member of the Pontifical Academy of Science. Among other positions he holds are those of adviser to the Sacred Congregation of Rites and membership on the Permanent Commission for the Protection of Historic and Artistic Monuments of the Holy See.

**Father Michael Browne**, Master General of the Dominican Order since 1955, was born in County Tipperary, Ireland, on May 8, 1887. He entered the Dominican Order in 1903 and completed his priestly studies in Rome and at the University of Fribourg, Switzerland. After some years spent teaching in Francis Crump, O.M.I., on a tour of the world, he served from 1931 to 1941 as rector of the Angelicum in Rome. He was appointed master of the Sacred Apostolic Palace in 1951, and in 1955 was elected Master General of the Dominican Order. Among his many other posts is membership in the Central Preparatory Commission for the Second Vatican Council.

## Prelate Raps Opening to Left

Vatican City — (NC) — Alfredo Cardinal Ottaviani, Secretary of the Sacred Congregation of the Holy Office, has sharply criticized current efforts to form an Italian government with the support of extreme leftists.

The Cardinal's statement, published by the ASSI News Agency Feb. 16, broke the silence the Italian hierarchy has so far observed regarding the so-called "opening to the left."

The decision to seek the "opening" was made Feb. 1 at the close of the national convention of the Catholic-oriented Christian Democratic party, which has governed Italy alone or in coalition since 1948.

The following day, Premier Amintore Fanfani resigned and announced he would seek to form a coalition government with the small Social Democratic and Republican parties that would have the support in Parliament of the leftist Socialist party, a former ally of the Communist party.

Cardinal Ottaviani said: "The teaching of the Church is constant and consistent. It rejects every kind of demagogical solution to social questions, and therefore also rejects every form of Marxism and materialism degrading to the human person and human dignity. The defense of Christian values is fundamental and binding on all Catholics who are en-

### New Topic For College

Jolo — (NC) — Bringing fish to the Philippine Islands seems simpler and less practical than carrying coals to Newcastle, but an American Bishop is doing it.

Graduates of the school will have the Oblate Bishop's help in starting fishing ventures on a sound financial basis, supported by their own cooperative.

Charleston — (NC) — The results of a census conducted last November in the Charleston diocese show that it has 12 per cent more Catholics than the number estimated prior to the census.

## 'Surprises' Expected In Council

Portland — (NC) — "I expect that after October 11 we may have some surprises for the world," the primate of the Greek Orthodox Church in North and South America, who will be an observer at the ecumenical council opening on that date, said here.

Archbishop Iakovos, one of the presidents of the World Council of Churches, declined (Feb. 10) to indicate what the "surprises" at the council might be.

"IT'S TOO early to speak of them," he said.

In a visit to Portland, Archbishop Iakovos stressed the theme of Christian unity in his public appearances.

A featured speaker at a banquet given by Greek Orthodox church members in honor of their archbishop was Msgr. Thomas J. Tobin, vicar general of the Catholic Archdiocese of Portland.

Archbishop Iakovos told a Catholic press spokesman that he will be an observer from the United States for his church at the Vatican council.

He said an official invitation to the council is expected within a month.

He was the first representative of the Ecumenical Patriarchate of the Orthodox Church to meet with a pope in centuries.
