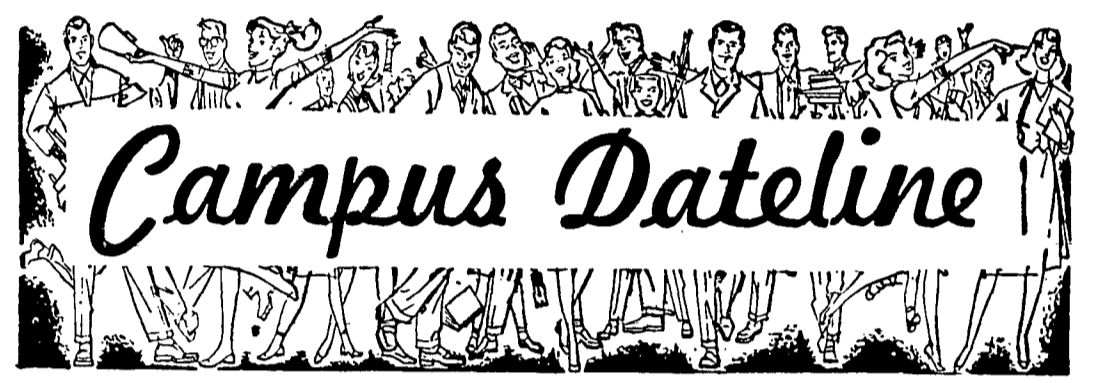




Leading Roles In 'Our Town'
