BORN AND brought up in Palmyra, Mr. Fox was educated in the Palmyra Classical Union School. As a young man he was employed at the Crandall Packing Company here.

In 1906 he joined Garlock Inc. where he remained for 37 years until his retirement in 1943. At that time he was a foreman in the shipping denartment.

The marriage of Mary M. Maioney and Henry Fox was solemnized at St. Anne's Church June 6, 1900 with the Rev. a mes Hartley officiating. Three of their children died at birth; the fourth lived only a few days: Mary Mahoney Fox is deceased.

The son of one of the origi nal founders of St. Anne's parish, Patrick Fox, Mr. Fox celebrated his 50 years as a trustee of the church in 1961. At that time, on the occasion of his 89th birthday, Rev. William Doran, pastor of St. Anne's, presented him with a gold head ed cane that was originally given to Rev. William Casey, St. Anne's first resident pastor.
