Henry Fox Mourned, Palmyra Parish Trustee

Palmyra—One of Palmyra's "first" citizens, Henry Fox, died Thursday, February 15, 1962 at his home at 312 Prospect Drive. He would have been 90 years old on May 18.

BORN AND brought up in Palmyra, Mr. Fox was educated in the Palmyra Classical Union School. As a young man he was employed at the Crandall Packing Company here.

In 1906 he joined Garlock Inc. where he remained for 37 years until his retirement in 1943. At that time he was a foreman in the shipping department.

The marriage of Mary M. Mahoney and Henry Fox was solemnized at St. Anne's Church June 6, 1900 with the Rev. James Hartley officiating. Three of their children died at birth; the fourth lived only a few days: Mary Mahoney Fox is deceased.

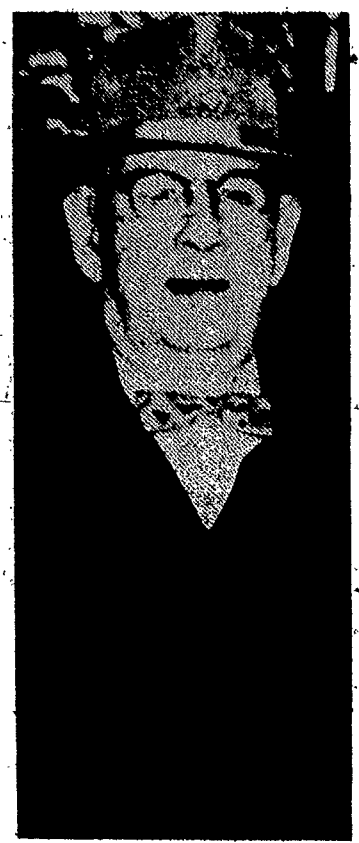
The son of one of the original founders of St. Anne's parish, Patrick Fox, Mr. Fox celebrated his 50 years as a trustee of the church in 1961. At that time, on the occasion of his 89th birthday, Rev. William Doran, pastor of St. Anne's, presented him with a gold headed cane that was originally given to Rev. William Casey, St. Anne's first resident pastor. Henry served Father Casey as sexton and altar boy.

Mr. Fox was a member of the Knights of Columbus and a former volunteer fireman. His 89 years were full ones.

Born in the turbulent years following the Civil War when our country was trying to mend the differences of neighbors, he saw a proud part of our history: the car and airplane in their infancy, and in his final year, man orbit the world.

Foremost of Mr. Fox's most pleasant days this past year was the occasion of the dedication of Palmyra's parochial school, St. Anne's. And before that, the day he and Patsy Hickey, fellow trustee, took part in the groundbreaking ceremony, and only a couple months ago, the erection of the statue of St. Anne at the entrance of the school.

HE IS survived by two sisters, Mrs. James McGuire and

The funeral service was held Saturday, February 17. Interment as in St. Anne's Cemetery, Palmyra.
