The program has been arranged by the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women and will begin at 9:15 a.m. and conclude with Mass at 11:30 a.m.

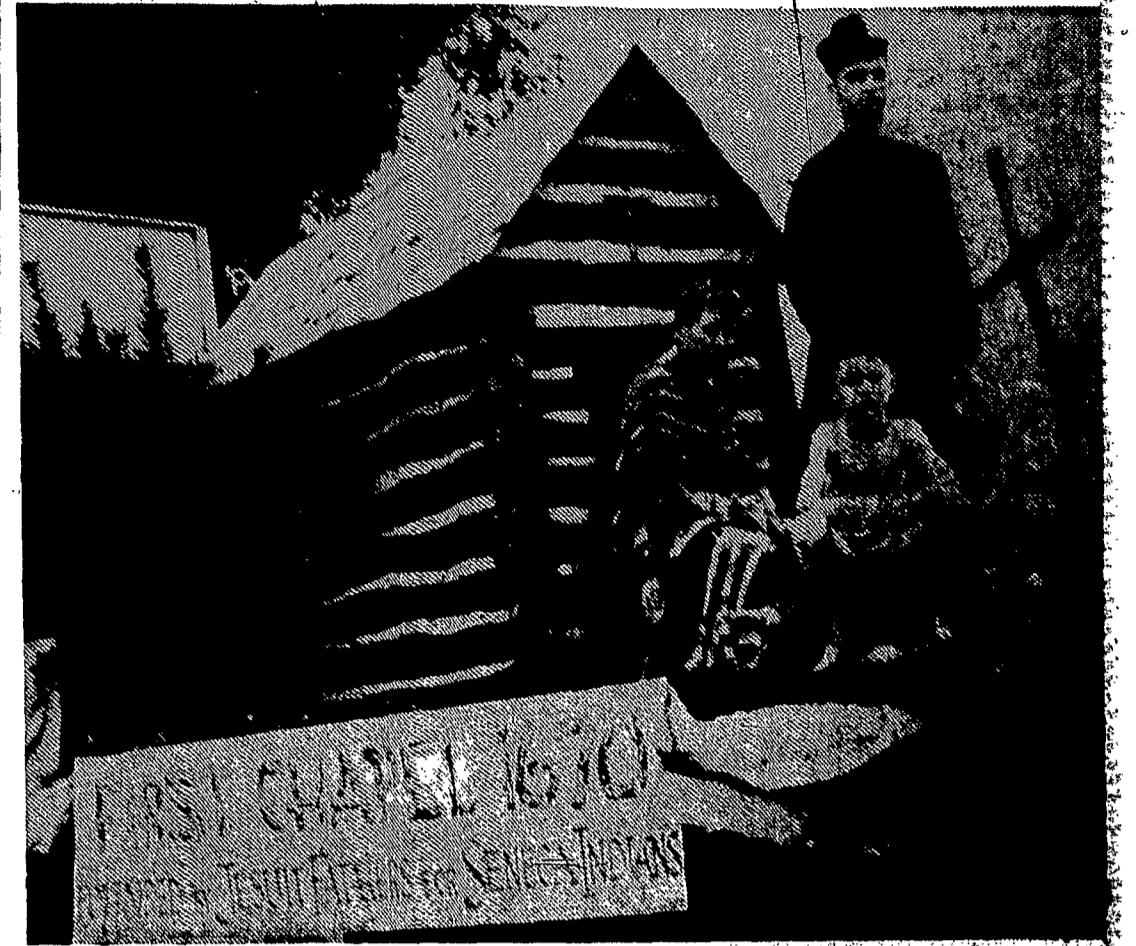
Parish and other organizations affiliated with the Diocesan Council will be represented at the workshop sessions.

Bishop Kearney To Offer Red Mass for Lawyers

The Lawyers' Red Mass, traditional service for the opening of Courts of Justice in this area, will be celebrated by Bishop Kearney in St. Joseph's Church, Franklin St., Wednesday, Sept. 12, at 9 a.m. The Bishop will preach the sermon.

Jurists, attorneys and prominent citizens of a seven-county area will attend.

Supreme Court Justice Daniel J. O'Mara is chairman of arrangements for the Red Mass. He suggests that all law offices in Rochester and Monroe County be closed until 10 a.m. on that morning to give all lawyers and their employees an opportunity to attend the Mass if they so desire.

Attorney Gerald R. Barrett heads an expenses-fund project in connection with the services.

INAUGURATED by Bishop Kearney in 1945, the Red Mass has also been celebrated since medieval times in most European countries at the opening of the new court term to invoke the blessing of the Holy Spirit on area courts of justice.

Pre-Cana Conferences To Open At Corpus Christi

A series of Pre-Cana Conferences will begin this Sunday, Sept. 9, at Corpus Christi Hall, 580 Main St. East. This Conference will begin at 3:00 p.m., as will all of them. It will last about two hours.

The complete series consists of four lectures treating the fundamental aspects of marriage, spiritual, moral, practical, physical, and psychological. Between now and next May there will be ten complete Conferences. These are so arranged that a couple can attend on any Sunday afternoon and complete the course in four weeks time.

It is also possible for couples to miss a lecture at one Church and substitute from a succeeding Conference at a different Church.

If anyone wishes a copy of the Pre-Cana schedule, they may have one by writing to the Family Life Bureau, 34 Monica Street, Rochester 19, N.Y. For a reference the date and place of the next four Conferences will be held at this parish and will continue there for four Sundays: Oct. 7, St. Andrew's School Hall; Nov. 4, Blessed Sacrament School Hall; Dec. 2, Holy Apostles School Hall; Jan. 6, 1963, St. John the Evangelist School Hall.

SPEAKERS for the first series will be the Rev. Gerald E.

Dunn, who will discuss, "God's Plan in Love and Marriage" on Sept. 9. "The Practical in Marriage" will be the topic of Mr. and Mrs. Wilfred Roehrig on Sept. 16. "A Catholic Doctor Looks at Marriage" will be the theme of Dr. Thomas Sweeney on Sept. 23. Closing this first series on Sept. 30 will be the Rev. Walter Cushing, speaking on "Spirituality in Marriage".

Certificates will be given to those who attend the complete course. These are to be presented to the parish priest who makes the parochial arrangements for marriage. Many parishes have made attendance at the Conferences obligatory and

so it is important that couples make early arrangements to attend. Supplementary literature and printed materials are given to those attending and a question period follows each lecture to give the couples the best opportunity to prepare for marriage.

Any couple in the Rochester area is invited. These are not limited to the members of the parish where they might be held. Singles are also welcome if their partner is unable to attend. Many newly married couples find the course profitable. During the past year at least 600 couples attended, setting a new high for the Diocese.

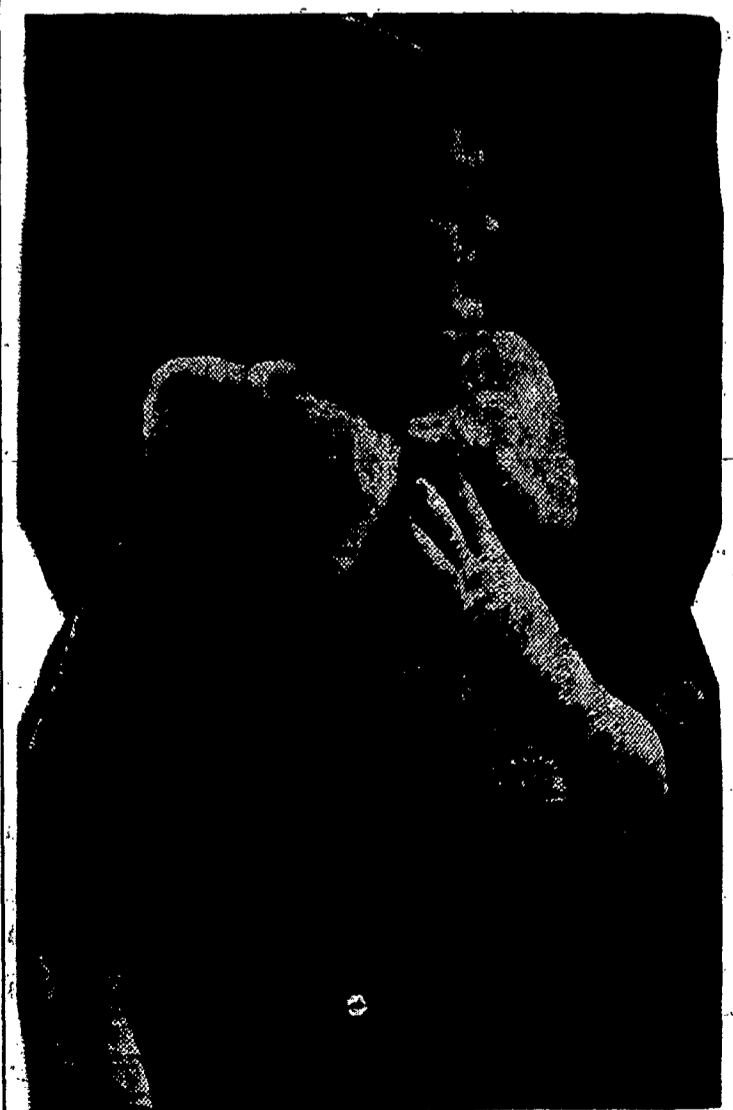
Unit To Open CYO Campaign
