

# Aquinas Gridmen In Top Form

A streamlined squad of 48 candidates, including 10 lettermen and several juniors who will be fighting for first string berths, reported to Aquinas Institute's head coach Joe Repko at the Dewey Avenue school for the season's first football practice last Saturday.

"I'M CERTAINLY pleased with the physical condition of most of these candidates," smiled Repko as he noted how well his boys held up in the grueling five hour work-out.

"I would say that 90 percent of these boys have followed the instructions we sent out early in the summer. We want our players to be strong," he said, but we also want them to be able to move. That's why we stressed the physical condition of our players so much. Moreover, top physical condition cuts down on injuries," he said.

Having established a basis for more speed and agility, Repko now will probably go ahead with his plan to develop a more open attack.

"The fact that we will be outweighed by a few of our opponents (Pittsburgh's line weighs 212 pounds) shouldn't hurt us if we can substitute more speed," explained the Irish against Corning Free Academy coach. "We may not have quite so much straight ahead power but we should have better lateral movements. This should help us especially on defense."

"Some of the lettermen are extremely inexperienced in major game competition," he said. However, he conceded that his center and guards were rugged and that he had good depth on the line.

Repko then went on to point

out that at quarterback, where experience is usually essential before a team can expect to go far, he has two lettermen who saw considerable action last season and another who performed well for Hunk Vadas' jayvees which was a powerhouse last year. "We have Brian Murphy and Bill Able who are lettermen and Mike Piehler, a junior," he said.

This is Repko's position-by-position view of the Irish: "We need more experience at the ends . . . I like the physical strength of our tackle squad. The guards might be the best spots in the line. The centers are strong. Quarterback position? Tell you in a few days. . . Halfback? We seem to have speed at left halfback and driving types at right halfback. . . The fullbacks are good."

Aquinas is faced once again with a tough schedule including Cleveland and Pittsburgh. Repko expects his charges to be ready for the season opener against Corning Free Academy on Friday evening, Sept. 21.
