Providence — (RNS) — A strongly worded statement re three-week informational campaign to acquaint the state's Roman Catholics with "the precarious state of our parochial schools" was announced here by Bishop Russell J. McVinney of Providence.

"Our Catholic parents have been very patient over the years and have carried the burden without protest," he said. "It is time that the entire community be given an appreciation of what this entails."

The drive opened with sermons at all Masses in all churches on "Catholic Education: Its Aims and Its Contribution to the Nation" and with the distribution of informational pamphlets.
