### John W. Martin Last Rites Held

Mt. Morris—Solemn Requiem Mass was said here Tuesday morning at St. Patrick's Church for John W. Martin, 92, one of Mt. Morris' oldest residents and business man. The Mass was said by his grandson, Rev. John Manion assisted by the Rev. Dominick J. Grasso, pastor and the Rev. John Connan, assistant pastor. Burial was in St. Patrick's Cemetery.

Mr. Martin died Saturday, Sept. 1, 1962, in Danville Memorial Hospital after a short illness. He was born in Seneca Falls and attended schools there. In early years he worked as a male nurse at Willard State Hospital and the Soldiers and Sailors Home in Bath.

In 1902 he became a licensed embalmer and came to Mt. Morris in 1910 and was associated with the late Alfred Harris in the furniture and undertaking business. In 1918 Mr. Martin bought out Harris and in 1934 the firm became known as John W. Martin and Son. At this time his son J. Harold Martin joined the business. Mr. Martin remained active in the business up until his recent illness. His wife, the late Helen Meath Martin, died in 1956.

Mr. Martin was a member of the Mt. Morris Board of Education for nearly 40 years. He was an honorary life member of the Danville Council, Knights of Columbus. He was a member of St. Patrick's Church.

Beside his son, J. Harold Martin he is survived by two daughters, Mrs. Loreta Manion of Herkimer and Miss Helen Janet Martin of Rochester; seven grandchildren and four great grandchildren.

## Hopes, Prayers for Council

Minneapolis — (NC) — The general secretary of the World Council of (Protestant and Orthodox) Churches said here the coming ecumenical council could advance Christian unity by dealing with religious liberty and mixed marriages.

Rev. Dr. W. A. Visser 't Hooft of the Geneva, Switzerland, headquarters of the council, spoke to the Minneapolis Ministerial Association.

He said Protestants and Orthodox should watch the council, which opens on October 11, "hopefully and prayerfully."

He said he hoped the council will make it possible for a continuing dialogue to take place in which Catholics and Non-Catholics could ask each other "some real questions."

The council, he said, could show "it means real business" as far as the cause of unity is concerned by beginning to work on some of the "real obstacles" that hinder better relations between Catholics and Non-Catholics in certain areas of the world. As examples, he then mentioned religious liberty and mixed marriages.

"We've found open ears among some (in the Vatican), but we haven't any idea whether the entire council will go along on these questions," the World Council executive said.

Dr. Visser 't Hooft said it now seems "quite clear" that delegate-observers from confessional families such as Lutheran, Orthodox and Anglicans will be invited to the council.

"This is a completely new thing," he observed. "In 1870 (when the first Vatican ecumenical council was held) this would have been completely unheard of."
