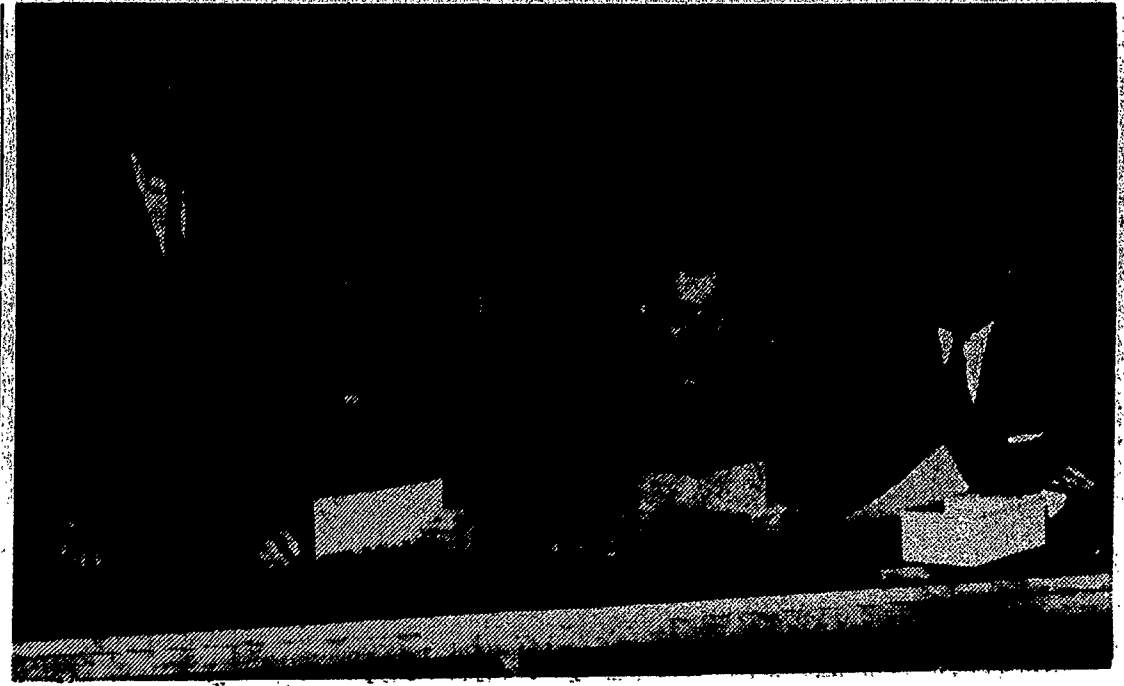

Dansville Parish Launches Drive

Dansville — Reduction of debt will be the principal aim of a campaign to be conducted among parishioners of St. Mary's Church Sept. 30 and Oct. 7, the Rev. Frederick L. Walz, pastor, announced last week.

Parishioners will be asked to increase regular Sunday offerings in order to accelerate debt elimination and save on interest payments, and to provide funds for future major building repairs.

CURRENT INDEBTEDNESS, Father Walz said, is \$143,000. The parish opened a new school and auditorium building in 1960.

Organization of a committee of 200 men to visit parishioners is now under way, with Robert F. Hart and Philip W. Blum as executive cochairmen. They announced that 60 members of the advanced solicitation committee will meet at 8 p.m. Monday in the auditorium. Top committeemen include:
