Bible Against Rain Rockets?

Johannesburg — (RNS) — Rockets — those which produce rain, and not satellites — have started a new religious controversy in South Africa.

The rockets, manufactured by a factory in Capetown, are used by farmers in South Africa's desert regions at \$25 apiece to "seed" rain clouds. Many farmers have been able to save their crops from drought in this way, while others, through misjudgments, have started downpours on neighboring farms instead of their own.

Now members of the Dutch Reformed Church have objected in their church magazine that it is against the Bible to "make" rain and send up satellites. Years ago similar objections were heard when rainmaking experiments were undertaken from aircraft in some regions. The experiments were stopped because of the objections.
