

Michael Moynihan Mass Offered By Priest-Son

His priest-son offered the Solemn Funeral Mass for Michael J. Moynihan, a dedicated police officer for 40 years and an active Catholic layman, Monday, Oct. 1 in Our Lady of Lourdes Church, Brighton.

Mr. Moynihan formerly Deputy Chief of Police, City of Rochester, whose home was at 2100 Highland Ave., died Sept. 27, 1962.

The Rev. Dr. James M. Moynihan, assistant at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church, the solemn Mass assisted by Rt. Rev. Msgr. Leslie G. Whalen, Deacon and Rev. Joseph T. Maloney, Sub-deacon.

"Mike" as he was known widely was a member of the Laymen's Retreat League and the Nocturnal Adoration Society, a fourth degree member of the Knights of Columbus, was a past grand commander of the Musa Caravan, Order of the Alhambra and member of the Holy Name Society of Our Lady of Lourdes Church.

Mr. Moynihan specialized in traffic problems and was long familiar around the city. Instrumental in developing the traffic and accident division, here he rose in the ranks from his appointment in April, 1922 to sergeant in 1927; lieutenant, 1943; captain, 1950; inspector, 1959 and deputy chief, Sept. 3, 1959.

He was elected vice president of the Police Benevolent Association last April.

Surviving his son also are his wife, Mrs. Carolyn Harigan Moynihan; his daughter, Miss Carolyn Anne Moynihan; a sister, Mrs. Daniel Murphy in Ireland; three brothers, Cornelius and Patrick in Ireland and Police Sergeant Jeremiah Moynihan of Rochester and many nieces and nephews.
