Three New Instructors Join College Faculty

The designer of the Mees Gallery of Photography at the Eastman House has joined an expanded Nazareth College art department. Tom Muir Wilson is one of three instructors joining the art faculty this year. Others are Sister Marie Angela, S.S.J., and Paul D. Richter. The latter returns to the faculty after a year's absence. He has been pursuing graduate studies at the University of Rochester under a Doctoral fellowship.

Wilson will teach sculpture and advanced design at Nazareth. He received his B.F.A. in Sculpture and Design from Granbrook Academy of Fine Arts in Bloomfield Hills, Michigan and his Master of Fine Arts in Design from Rochester Institute of Technology in 1961. He has taught photography, metal smithing and woodworking and is currently design consultant for the Eastman House.

Sister Marie Angela will teach ceramics. She is a Nazareth College graduate and a graduate student in Ceramics at the School for American Craftsmen in Rochester.

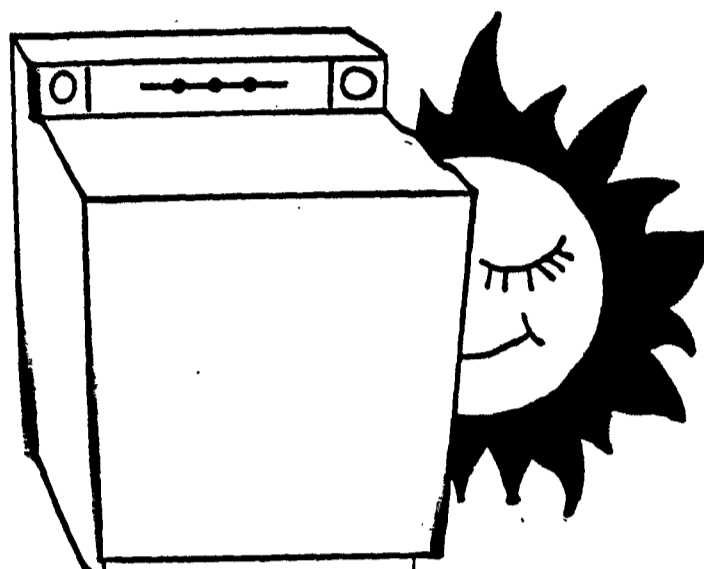

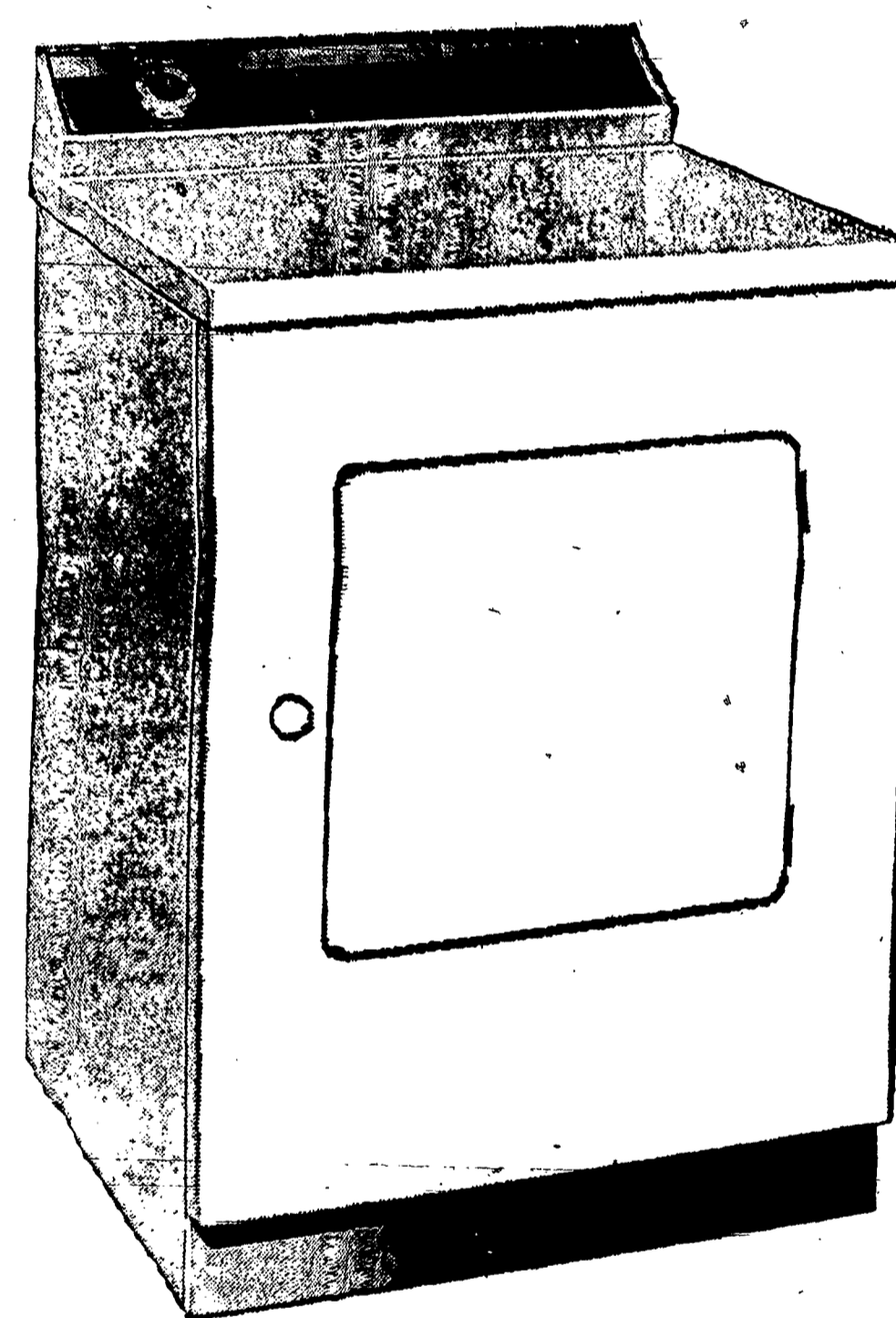

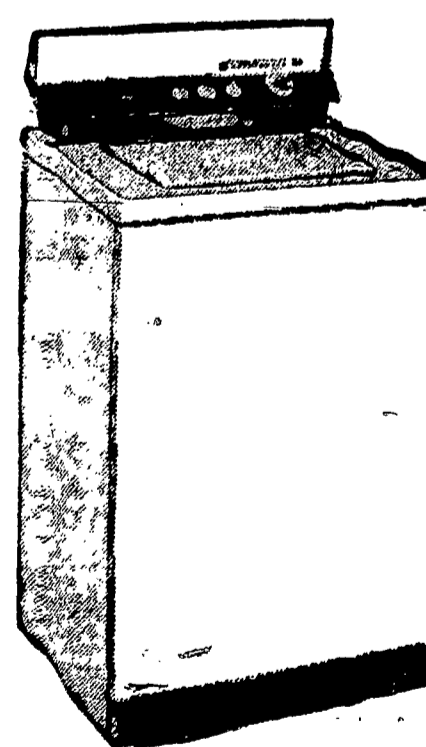
