Georgetown University gave its John Carroll Award to five of its distinguished alumni, three of them Rochesterians, at a dinner in the Sheraton Hotel Saturday, Sept. 29. William S. Catherwood, alumni president, presented the award to B. Edward Shlesinger, Hon. James P. B. Duffy, Mrs. Margaret Baggett Dolan, Col. Leo A. Codd and Dr. Joseph A. Lane, Jesuit Father Brian A. McGrath, vice president of the

university, spoke on the "three revolutions in our day that surpass the hydrogen bomb or the space shot to Venus and the moon." The three are revolutions "in the area of knowledge . . . the field of communications . . . and in political-social-economic life." He said Georgetown like other Catholic colleges must give students "a sense of tradition and development, a sense of justice and idealism."

Washington — (NC) — A \$1,000 item for distribution of birth control information at local maternal and child welfare clinics is included in the District of Columbia budget for the 1963-64 fiscal year.

The District's budget bill, including the birth control item, has been approved by both the Senate and House, although other differences between the two versions have made necessary a Senate-House conference.

The \$1,000 requested in the budget would be for distribution of birth control pamphlets at clinics.
