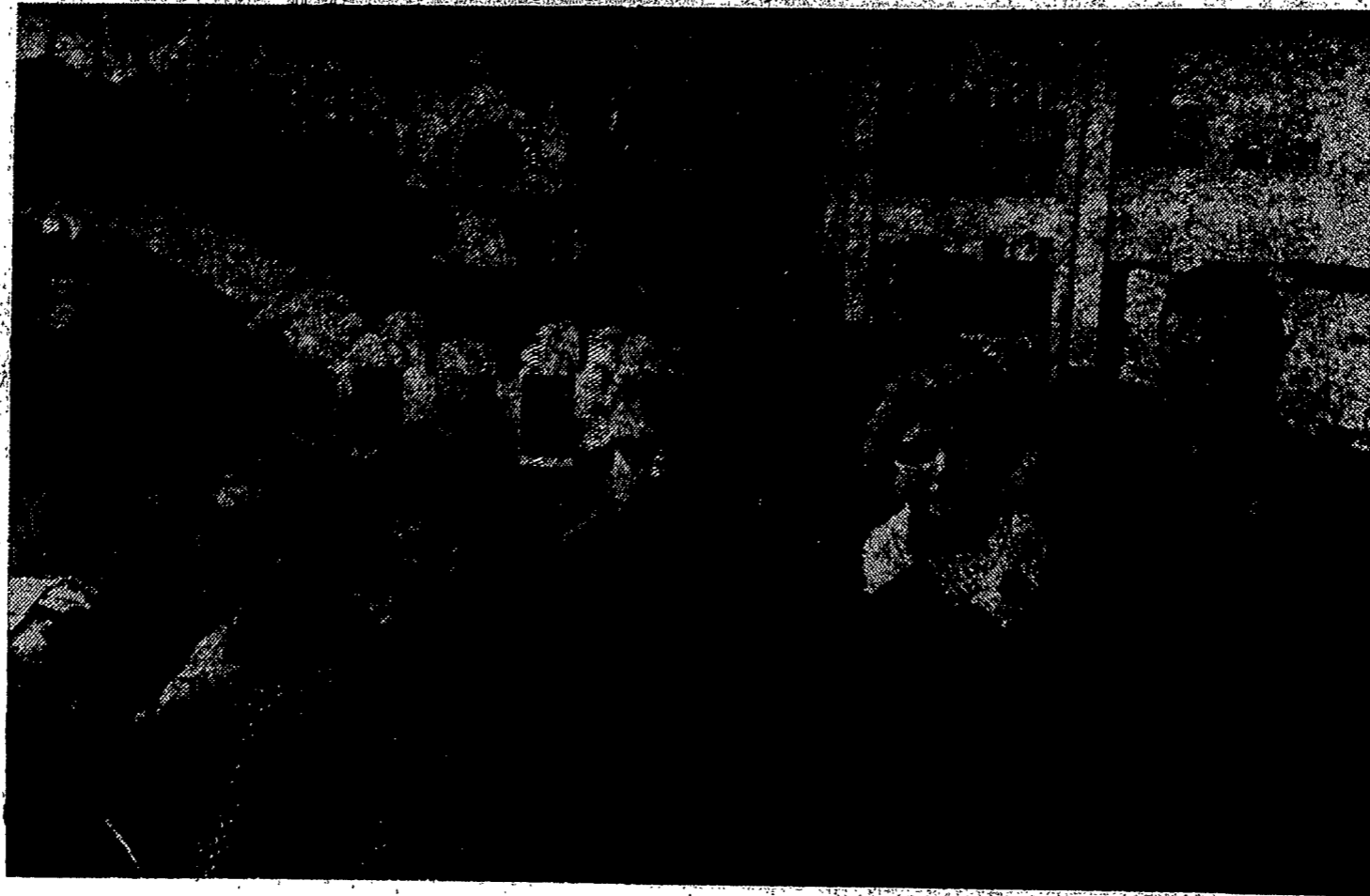
Rev. William M. Roche, Superintendent of Catholic Schools, introduced both speakers.

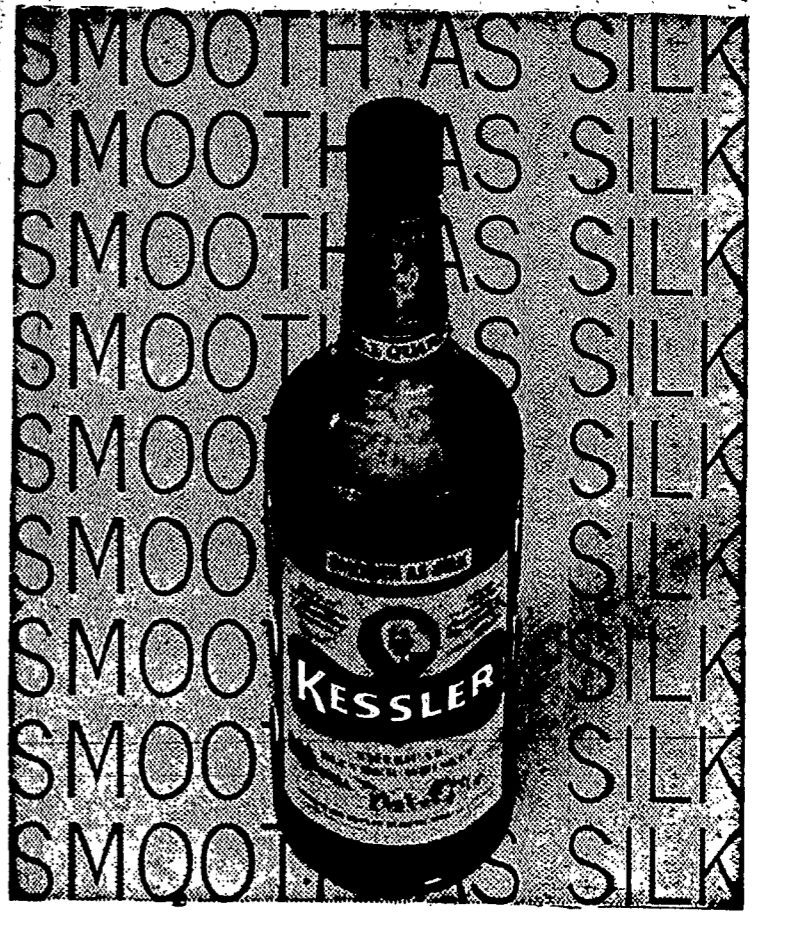

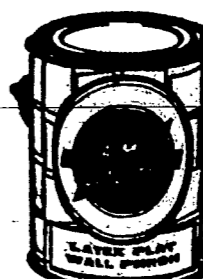
