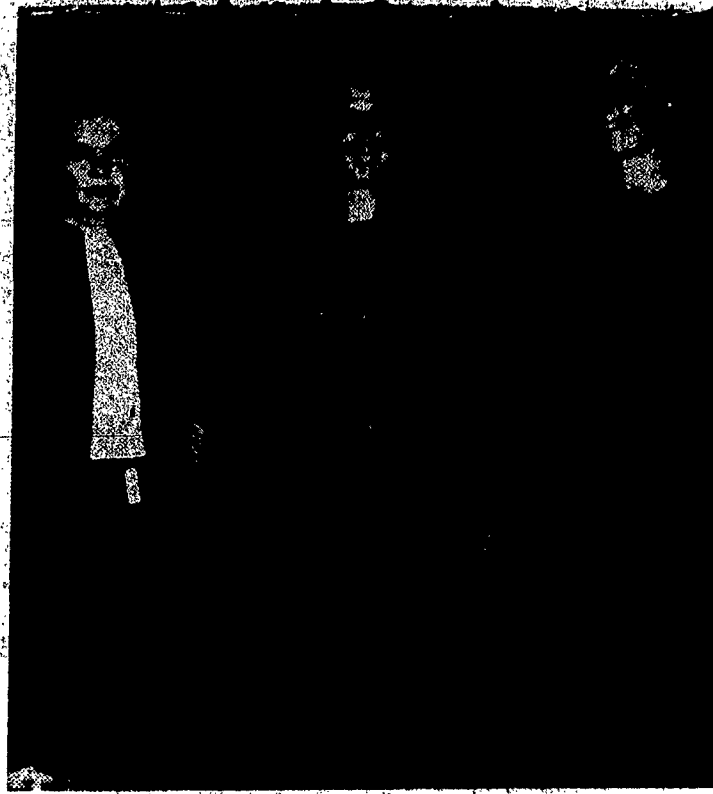
New Rambler Viewed At Ailing & Miles
