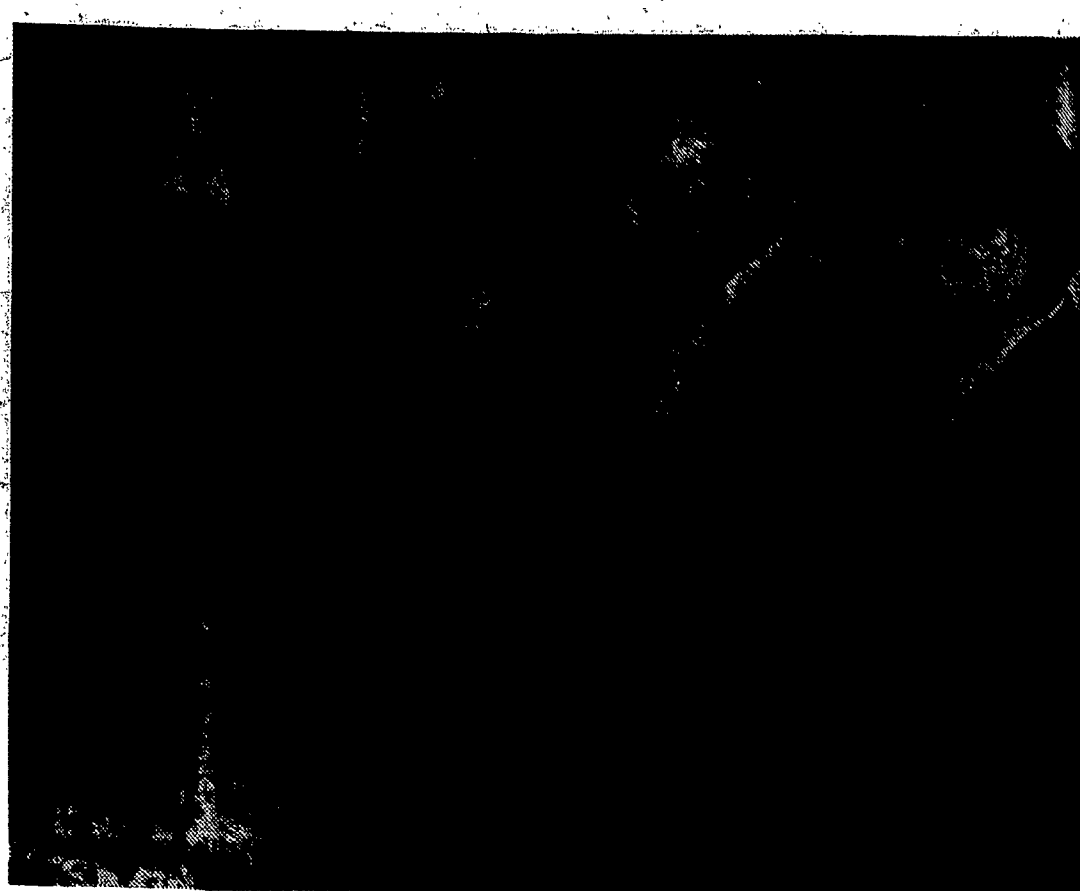

Ephesus Rites Recall 5th Century Council

Vatican City — (RNS) — A Vatican mission left from the Ciampino airport outside Rome for Ephesus in Turkey, site of the third Ecumenical Council, where special ceremonies were planned for Oct. 8, shortly before the opening of the Second Vatican Council.

The Council of Ephesus, held in 431, declared that the Blessed Virgin was truly the Mother of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity made Man. The Second Vatican Council is opening on Oct. 11, the Feast of the Maternity of Our Lady.

It was announced that the Vatican mission was going to Turkey at the invitation of the Turkish government, and would be led by Archbishop Francesco Lardone, Papal Internuncio to Turkey.

The mission carried a message from Pope John XXIII and various gifts from the pontiff for the Catholic community in Ephesus. It was also scheduled to visit Istanbul before returning to the Vatican on Oct. 12.

Rites in Biblical history, Ephesus is reputed also to be the site of the Blessed Virgin's death and Assumption. Although nothing is known from
