

Refugees Find New Home

Wellington — (NC) — Five wayworn Catholic families have started a new life after years of unsettled existence in European refugee camps.

The families — two Polish, two Yugoslav and one Hungarian — arrived at the airport here after a trip financed by the Office of the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees. The families, sponsored by the Catholic Immigration Committee here, are staying in hostels of the St. Vincent de Paul Society until they get settled in new homes and jobs.

James R. Gaynor, chairman of the Catholic Immigration Committee and national president of the St. Vincent de Paul Society when they arrived. He said the city, welcomed the families some of them had been lingering for years in refugee camps because of physical disabilities caused by wartime privations and ill-treatment.

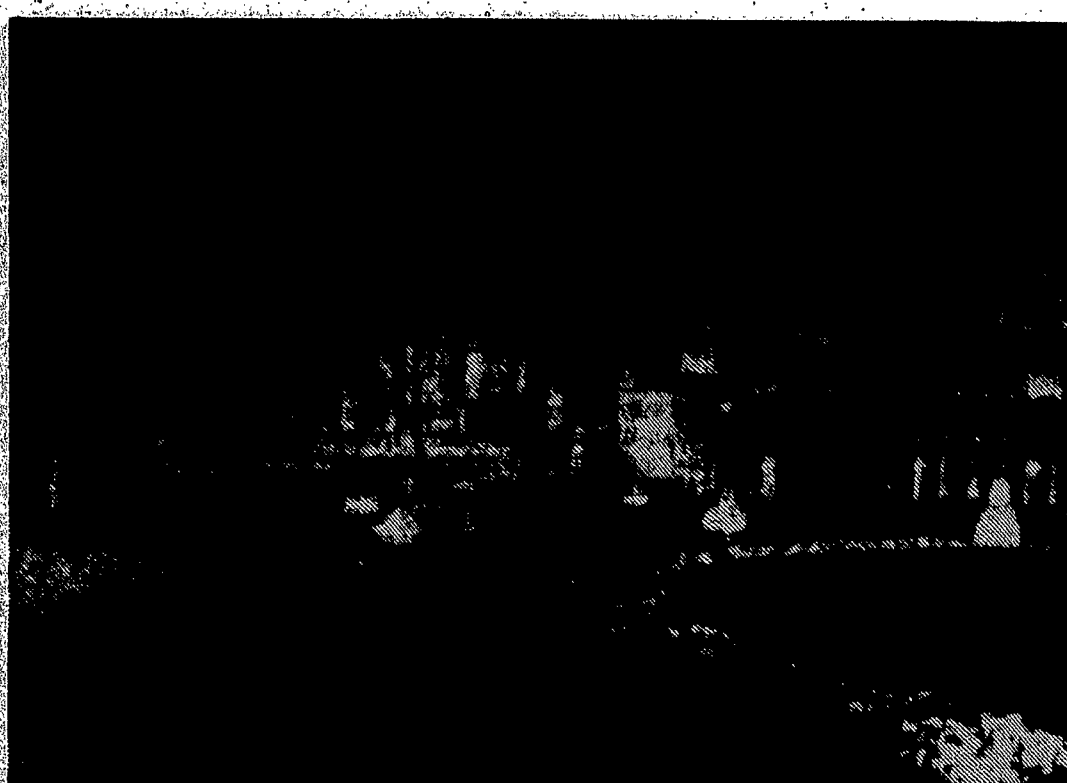

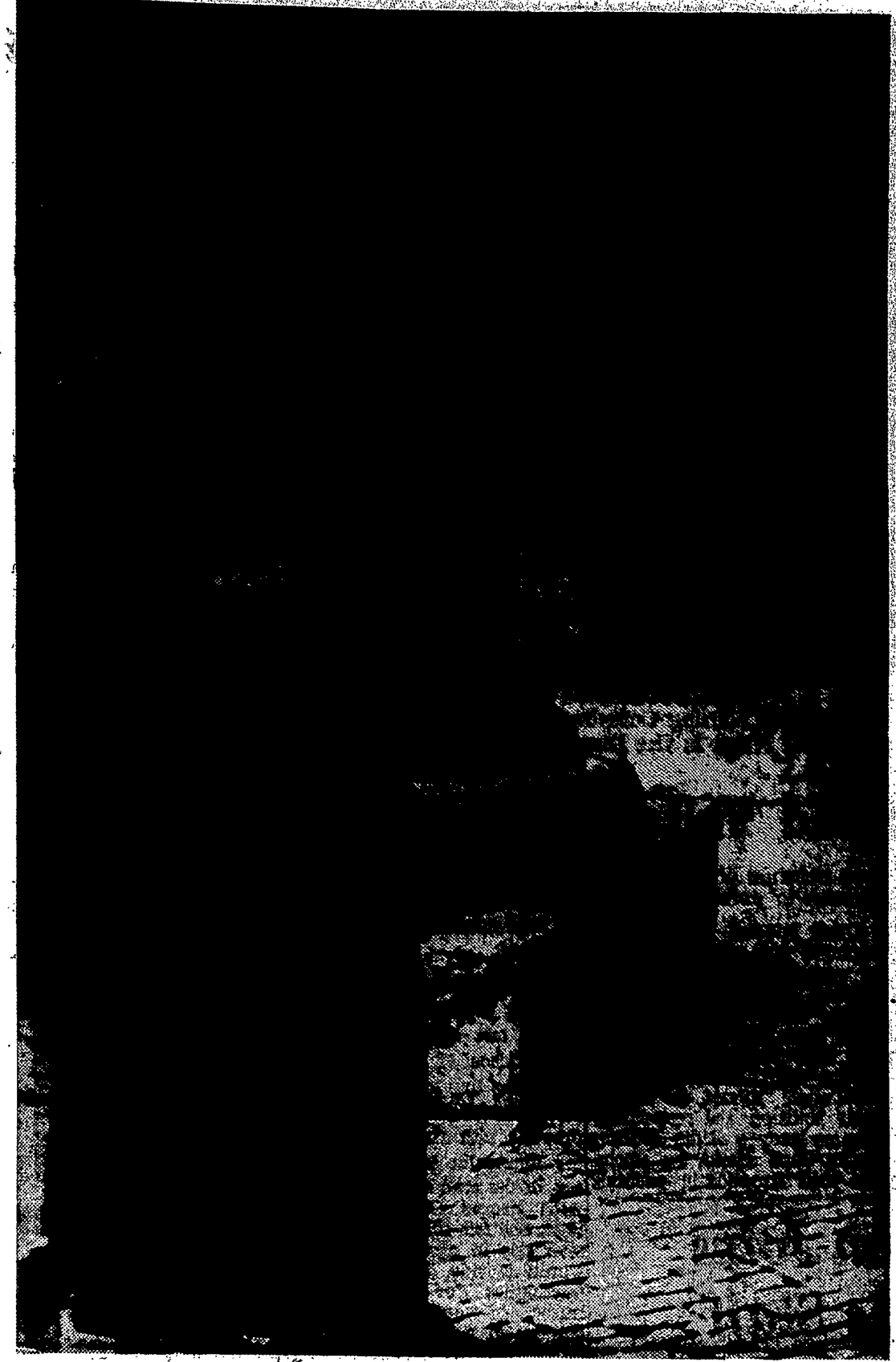

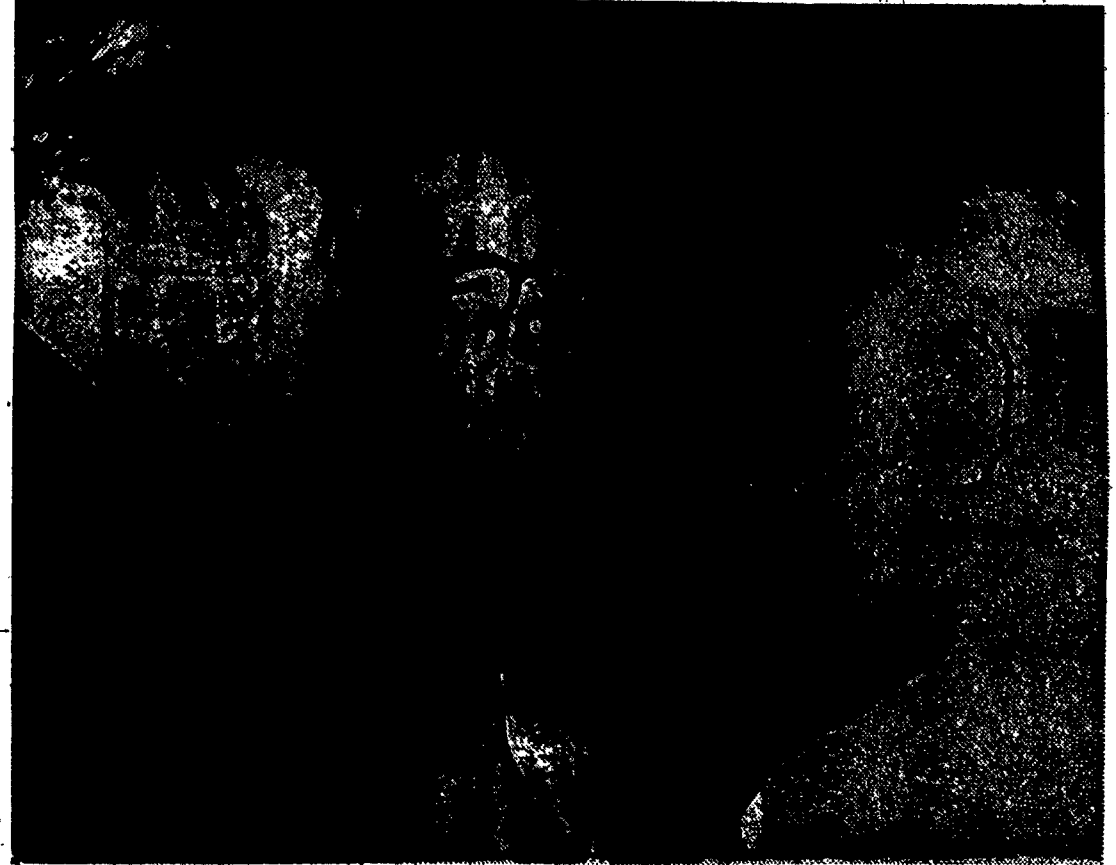

'Containment' Limits Pupils

St. Louis — (RNS) — Some 14,000 Catholic children will be turned away from parochial school first grade classrooms in the city and county during the next five years, Msgr. James T. Curtin, superintendent of schools for the St. Louis archdiocese, announced here.

During the same period, he added, some 9,000 Catholic eighth-grade graduates would be admitted to Catholic high schools here.

In September the archdiocese announced that it would be forced to undergo a policy of "containment" in the building of Catholic elementary and high schools because of the shortage of qualified teachers.

Msgr. Curtin said the yardstick to determine who will be accepted in the Catholic schools and who will be turned away has not yet been determined.

The Name's The Same

Detroit — (NC) — Two parishes, which have the same patron, but which are located on different continents, have adopted each other in a parish-to-parish program designed to enlarge the Catholic's personal concept of the Church's universality.

St. Aloysius' parish, located in downtown Detroit, has adopted a newer St. Aloysius' parish in the primitive reaches of Tarime, Tanganyika. The church in Africa now is under construction.

The mission project grew out of a 1958 visit of Detroit's Father Walter J. Schoenherr, now pastor of St. Aloysius', to south and central Africa.

While there, the Detroitier met a Maryknoll missionary, Father James Kuhn. Father Kuhn suggested the idea of "adopting" a parish — just as some parish societies and mission aid organizations "adopt" their own missionaries.

Financial help was to be part of the plan — but only part.

The rest was in the benefit to be gained by understanding the people of another country, the spiritual closeness that could come between the two groups of so varying backgrounds.

At Detroit's St. Aloysius' parish, there is an offering box into which alms are dropped for Africa's St. Aloysius'. So far \$400 has been sent to Father Kuhn.
