Planned opening of a new parochial school next September in Perinton, two miles east of Pittsford Village, was announced this week by the Rev. John W. LeVeque, pastor of the newly-established St. John of Rochester parish.

Organization of a 200-man committee is under way to conduct a parishwide campaign for pledges toward a proposed combination church-school building to be erected at the corner of Palmyra Road (Route 31) and Wickford Way.

FATHER LEVEQUE said St. John of Rochester School will open with grades one, two, three and four, with one class being added each successive year through the eighth grade. The Sisters of Mercy will staff the school.
